"Why I'm Optimistic About Our Nation's Future"

I was never patriotic un-til I left the country. My junior year of high school was spent in Taipei, Taiwan. Before I left I was ecstatic. I had it all planned. I would learn Mandarin Chinese, make hundreds of Taiwanese friends, and then live happily ever after as an expat. When I got to Taiwan I had to become more realistic. I did not learn Chinese in a day and most of my friends were other exchange students who came from all over the world.

The Taiwanese are inquisitive people; they want to get to know who you are. Unfortunately their English was as bad as my their English was as bad as my Chinese, so our conversations were short. They would always ask the same question. "Ni shi na gou ren?" and my answer was always the same, "Wo shi mei gou ren." I am an American. Those words had never meant anything to me had never meant anything to me before, now they were part of my identity

In the fall of my exchange, the program organized a Halloween costume party for all the exchange students and Taiwanese students who had been on past exchanges. We came as cats, witches, and zombies, all normal things, but one costume stood out. A Taiwanese student arrived dressed as Osama Bin Laden. Suddenly this party wasn't fun.

For the American exchange students it was a face we had seen our entire lives. It had been paired with the images of inno-cent men and woman jumping from the towers to their deaths when they were no longer able to stand the powerful smoke and tempera-tures inside. To us, his costume felt like a punch in the gut. First people were angry and then they

were sad. Some people wanted to yell, others wanted to hit him. We swallowed those ideas though and took him aside and explained why his costume affected so many

people in such a negative way. He was shocked. He didn't know that it was a big deal; he hardly knew who Osama was. He very kindly took off the more recognizable parts of his costume. What I found encouraging about that night is that we solved the problem with kindness. No scene was made. No one was any the wiser it had even been a problem. We found we could be ambassadors for our country talking through issues, understanding why we had different opinions, and finding an ultimate solution.

Taiwan is a country where people do what is expected of them. Students are told to learn.

Learning is demonstrated by test scores. Even in their preschools students sit at desks for hours each day

Í believe this has left a hole in their education, especially when it comes to problem solving.

At my high school I was often left in the library because they were fearful that I might drop their school's rank, which was derived from tests taken every four weeks. I began to notice that students

didn't learn - they memorized. On one of my days in the li-brary I watched two students at-tempt to open a door. The door's sign said, "Push to open." They followed this instruction precisely. They pushed, it stayed put. The two students tried for over five minutes before giving up. I decided to have a crack at it. I went over and looked at the door. It appeared to be locked. I turned the deadbolt and

pushed open the door.

As an American I have learned to solve problems. In the United States we are far

too stubborn to give up. If some-thing is broken we will find a way to fix it, even if we have to create something entirely new.

Our nation has problems, and yet, in a magnificent way, when they hit we keep going. When the government shut down this year we took a view that reflects those of the colonies that once rebelled over a tax on tea. We understood that a shutdown happened, it concerned us, and then we went to work. Our immediate response was to push on into the future.

This is why I am optimis-tic about our future, when we hit snags we keep going. When something bad happens, we talk our way through it. I am optimistic because the United States of America is a nation of people who solve problems and never give up. Sometimes this means our furniture isn't always put together the way the instructions would like, but it still holds our weight.

We may get hurt or our na-tion finds itself in conflict, but we move forward and find resolutions. Our country has such a high level of tenacity and the will to continue to find new solutions even though the future does not contain certainty. We know when the going gets tough, the tough get inventive. This is the United States that makes me patriotic and that is why this Country always will be what makes me optimistic.

DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS SOUTHERN COLORADO LAND ACQUISITION FACT SHEET

VA takes seriously its commitment to provide a final resting place and lasting tribute to the men and women who have sacrificed to protect our nation, and on January 21, 2014, the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) completed the purchase of 374 acres of land in Colorado Springs, El Paso County, Colorado for a new national cemetery. The site, known as Rolling Hills, was purchased from CS 2005 Investments, LLC, a Colorado limited liability company, located at 4908 Tower Road, Denver, Colorado.

This new national cemetery will serve an estimated population of 95,000 Veterans and family members, which are not currently served with an open national, State, or tribal Veteran's cemetery, within 75 miles of their residence.

Southern Colorado qualifies for a new national cemetery based on VA policy, which states that new national cemeteries may be established where at least 80,000 Veterans are not currently served with an open national, State, or tribal Veterans cemetery within 75 miles of their residence. This policy was approved by Congress as part of VA's FY2011 budget request.

In Fall 2011, VA issued an advertisement to provide land that would convey with associated water rights to serve as the proposed national cemetery in southern Colorado. Based on the cumulative results of real estate analyses, and the time and cost associated with each option, the Department selected the Rolling Hills site as VA's preferred option.

The fair market value (FMV) was established as \$12,000 per acre, for a total cost of \$4.49 million. Irrespective of the present zoning (this property's current use is as agricultural/grazing land and has a state tax assessed value of \$6.68 per acre), in accordance with Federal regulations, VA is required to pay FMV based on the highest and best use of the property (as residential, mixed with neighborhood commercial use). A professional appraisal was conducted by an independent state-licensed Member of the Appraisal Institute (MAI) and the methodology and the findings of the appraisal were confirmed by a review appraisal. Upon appropriation of construction funding, VA will proceed with the initial phase of

construction which includes development of cemetery roads, an entrance, administration and Public Information Center, committal shelters, and a maintenance facility along with an approximate 10 year initial burial capacity of casket gravesites, cremation sites, and columbarium niches needed to accommodate approximately 10 years of burial demand.

This year training has been a big part of what we as Team Colorado wanted to accomplish. The problem with this, with all the training De-

partment of Colorado has done, we still see many problems out there. Reports, bonds, insurance, 990's(IRS tax exempt filing), Secretary of State Incorporation good standing status, quarterly trustee audit reports, and community service reports. All of these are required each year, except for the community service report. Some Posts have not filed the 990's in over three years, which means they have lost their Federal Tax Exempt status and must file the required forms to get it back, and there is a fine (around \$500.00) to pay also. The Insurance is required to be renewed every year. It must have both National VFW and Department of Colorado as payee's on the insurance form. The Colorado Secretary of State Status of Good Standing, is required every year. If you fail to do this, when you finally do get it done it will cost you more than the annual \$10.00.

Post Quartermaster Bonds are required every year. They are due by August 31 of each year, yet we have to continually call, send letters etc to get the Post to get them done. 1 September of each year the Post Quartermaster is no longer bonded. If something happens and the Post quarterly trustee audits have not been done or done wrong, then the bonding company is not obligated to pay. The quarterly trustee audit is due at the end of the month, following the end of each quarter. Example: current audit that is due is for the quarter that ended in December. The audit was due into Department Headquarters by the end of January.

All Posts in Colorado do something to assist the community, or veterans etc. A lot of the posts do not report this on the community service report. It should be reported so that the Post can get credit for it.

All these reports are on the Department web site at www.vfwcolodept.org Then go to District reports. Open the District your post is in and you can see where the Post stands or if a report that was submitted does not show up. District Commanders should be using this tool to assist them in assisting their Posts and helping them get the reports in. The Post Commander is responsible to make sure all these reports are done and turned in. All Posts should have the new Podium edition of the National By laws, Manual of Procedure and rituals. This is also a must. Each Post and District should be purchasing this around October of each year. All the changes approved at the National Convention are incorporated into the new book each year.

If you have questions about any of this contact your District Commander, they should be able to assist you in getting these taken care of. If the District Commander needs help they can call the Team Colorado District Liaison. I hope this helps Posts out there understand the reports and the how's and why's. Let's finish on a strong note this year.

We have several Post's in the Department who either did not do an audit, or just put some numbers on a page and turned it in. Then when a problem with funds arose, the bonding company would not cover the loss due to audit problems. Please take your time and do them correctly. Or better yet, go on line to vfwcolodept.org, the Department web site. Find the tab near the top named "Forms". Scroll down to the Quartermasters section and find the "Trustees (Fillable) Report of Audit Form 2013-2014. Fill in the blanks like you would on the paper form and it will automatically do the math. Print the form out, keep one for your Post, or District, and send the other



GENERAL ORDERS NO. 3 February 1, 2014 2013-2014

Please remind all Posts that you MUST be 100% +1 to qualify for All State. Deadline is April 30, 2014. <u>Entry forms</u> will be mailed to all that qualify.

1. As prescribed by Sec 217 & Sec 221 of the National By-Laws and Manual of Procedure, Posts having two (2) meetings a month will hold nominations at the first meeting in April with elections at the next regular in April. While Posts with only (1) one meeting a month will hold nominations in March and elections in April and that all members must be notified of such elections.

(a) The officers of each Post will consist of a Commander, Senior Vice Commander, Junior Vice Commander, Quartermaster, Adjutant, Chaplain, Judge Advocate, Surgeon and three (3) Trustees.

(b) The Post shall elect the Commander, Senior Vice Commander, Junior Vice Commander, Quartermaster, Chaplain and three trustees.

(c) The Appointed officers of each Post shall consist of at least an Adjutant, Judge Advocate, Surgeon, Officer of the Day, Service Officer and Guard to be appointed as prescribed in Section 216 in the Manual of Procedure.

2. Proof of Eligibility Requirements for Officers: All Posts, Districts and Department should be reminded of the provisions of Sec. 216(c), 316, 414(c), and 515(d) of the National By-Laws and Manual or procedure that officers, elected and appointed, shall not be installed or assume the duties of their office until such proof of eligibility has been submitted to the respective Adjutant for review.

3. Registration for the VFW National Convention: Each Post will pay, in advance, a national registration fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25) which shall entitle the Post to a packet of convention information and materials and one identified registered delegate for the National Convention. Each additional delegate attending the national convention will pay a ten dollar (\$10) delegate fee, in accordance with the requirements of Sec 222 of the National Constitution and By-Laws. **Delegate fees should be sent directly to the Quartermaster General at National Headquarters**.

4. Attention is directed to Sec. 213 of the National By-Laws concerning arrearages of Posts for National, Department, or District Dues, National Convention registration, poppy money, supply money or other financial obligations, or failure to have the office of Quartermaster properly bonded in accordance with Section 703 of the National By-Laws, or failure to submit properly completed quarterly Post Trustees Report of Audit or Post Election Reports. Posts that are delinquent in any of the aforementioned shall be deprived of all representation in County Council meetings, District, Department and National Conventions.

5. Attention of Post Commanders is directed to Sec. 218, Manual of Procedure, Duty of Trustees. Trustees Report of Audit must be completed by the Trustees, in detail, at the close of each quarter, one of which ends March 31st. Commanders are reminded that all funds are to be under the custody and control of the Post Quartermaster. Persons other than the Post Quartermaster who may handle Post funds, such as club manager, bingo chairman, or committee chairmen are responsible to the Post Quartermaster to maintain accurate records and accounts and should be properly bonded. Post Trustees are to ensure that the financial records of these special funds are also audited in the same manner as the other accounts of the Post Ouartermaster.

6. Commanders on all levels should begin organizing their 2014 Memorial Day Buddy Poppy Campaign. To qualify for Post All American, VFW Posts must order a minimum of five (5) Buddy Poppies per member for the program year from Department Headquarters.

7. All-State Commanders and Quartermasters. Entry forms for All-State Commanders and Quartermasters <u>will be</u> <u>mailed to all qualified persons</u>. Posts and Districts must be 100% + 1 in membership by April 30, 2014, in order for the Commanders and/or Quartermasters to be eligible for this award. The Commander's Department Leadership Manual, along with the entry form, must arrive at Department Headquarters not later than close of business on Wednesday May 07, 2014, to be judged. Post Quartermasters need only submit the entry form by the same deadline date.

8. Council of Administration meeting will be April 5, 2014 at VFW Post No. 2551, 208 W Beaver, Fort Morgan, 8:30 am for Joint Meeting. Workshops will begin April 4 at the Post home 10:00 am.

9. State Convention is scheduled for Montrose, Colorado, June 18 through June 22, 2014. See Page 8 of the Colorado Veteran for pre-registration, golf, hotels and Convention Book ads.

The facility in named after a Medal of Honor recipient from Florence and is located on a ridge overlooking the city. The home has 105 operating beds, including a 14bed special care/Alzheimer's unit.

The mission of the McCandless facility is to honor and serve our nation's veterans, their spouses and the Gold Star Parents by creating opportunities for meaningful activity, continued growth and feeling of self-worth in resident-centered long term care and supportive living environments. Their vision is that residents experience compassion, dignity and companionship in communities filled with life, love and laughter. These facilities are structured housing with supportive case management by expert staff and community resources that help veterans make a successful transition to independent living. I have visited both of these facilities and talked with veterans and the counselors.

I look forward to visiting with you at the Council of Administration meeting April 5 and 6 in Fort Morgan at Post #2551. Let's all work together to support and honor veterans!

Legislative Update

Once again those members of Congress who we sent to Washington to represent us have chipped away on our benefits and entitlements. They passed a bill, the Bipartisan Budget Act, signed by the President, to reduce the annual Cost of Living Allowance one percentage point for military retirees until they reach age 62.

This law will reduce the income of any retiree from the service one (1) every year until they reach sixty two. This could range from \$85,000 to \$120,000. This law is not supposed to effect veterans' benefits for serviceconnected disability. It also requires that future benefits be adjusted in include the lost COLA after they reach

age sixty two. After that, the retirees will receive their full COLA equal to inflation each year.

It is imperative that every member of our great organization contact their member of Congress and tell the to repeal this provision in the law. Remind them that their action impacts veterans and survivors, hurts the troops, and their families and puts our national security at risk. Tell them they need to support the pending legislation, the Military Retirement Restoration act, that is pending.

They will listen to you because you are their constituent and you vote!

State Convention Buddy Poppy Display Contest

A Buddy Poppy Display Contest will again be held in connection with the State Convention. Rules have been designed to put emphasis on the purpose and effectiveness of the displays. rules

(1). Displays will be presented and judged in four categories:

CATEGORY 1 Public Promotion of Poppy Campaign.

(Window, booth, parade, poster displays, campaign promotions, etc.)

(a). Displays must be designed for public exposure and must bear a message soliciting a donation for and wearing of the VFW Buddy Poppy

(b). At least one Poppy used in the display must be in its original form and color, with label attached.

CATEGORY 2 Memorial or Inspirational Displays

(Wreaths, memorial tablets or plaques, patriotic or devotional themes)

(a). Displays must be designed to honor the dead, to inspire devotion to God and Country, or to dramatize the activities supported by the Buddy Poppy.

(b). At least one Poppy used in the display must be in its original form and color, with label attached.

CATEGORY 3 Artistic or Decorative Use of Poppies

(Post Home displays, table centerpieces, corsages, pictures, plaques, models, scenes, hats, novelty pieces, etc.)

(a). Any display not meeting the qualifications for Categories 1 or 2 shall automatically be entered in Category 3.

(b). At least one Poppy used in the display must be in its original form and color, with label attached

CATEGORY 4 Memorial or Inspirational Displays (Jr. Units)

(a). Display must be designed to honor the dead, to inspire devotion to God and Country, or to dramatize the activities supported by the Buddy Poppy.

(b). At least one of the Poppies used in the display must be in its original form and color, with label attached.

The State Buddy Poppy Committee shall have no responsibility in setting up, taking down, or returning displays. Displays may be entered and set up at any time from 7:30 a.m. Thursday June 14. Displays shall be set up in space provided in the Convention exhibit or meeting halls. At the time the display is set up, the responsible person must complete an entry form which will show the category of competition, the number of Poppies used, the purpose of the display, the use to which it has been put and plans for future use, the Post and/or Auxiliary number and location, and the name of the person who will dismantle and remove the display at the close of the Convention. Displays may be accompanied by a white card, not to exceed 4 inches by 6 inches in size, on which is lettered in black ink an explanation of the theme for the display or other information of interest to the viewer or the judges. Post name, number or location may not be visible on display entries; failure to comply will result in disqualification.

judging

Judging of displays will be on the basis of effectiveness, purpose, clarity of theme, suitability, originality, beauty and number of Poppies used. Where a sample of a large number of identical items (such as corsages or wreaths) is entered, full credit shall be given for the total number of Poppies used.

prizes

Plaques will be awarded to the first, second, and third place winners in each of the four categories. Plaques will be awarded at the Military Banquet when the winners are announced.

First Place Winners in each Category

First Place winners in each category will be eligible to be taken to National Convention and be entered in their respective category. Entry forms must be signed by the Department Adjutant. If someone from your Post or Auxiliary is not taking the entry to National Convention, you must des-ignate someone to be responsible to set up and take down the display at National Convention.

3.ELECTED OFFICERS, CHAIR-MAN ON ALL LEVELS AND ALL MEMBERS: In order to be considered a member in good standing, your 2014 dues must be paid by December 31, 2013 or you are no longer in good standing and will not be permitted to hold an office, or be eligible for a cancer grant, if otherwise eligible

4. MEMBERSHIP: Keeping your membership current is the easiest way to keep our organization membership whole and healthy. If you have not already paid your 2014 dues, your membership ceased to be in good standing as of December 31, 2013. Please pay your 2014 dues now. Your dues help to keep our congressional voice strong for military, veterans and families. Having your dues current also entitles you to receive a cancer grant, provided the eligibility requirement is met. Recruit new members by always carrying an application card with you. Use it to sign up your friends and family. The Ladies Auxiliary shall fix an admission fee not less than \$5.00 per member. This entitles each new member to a membership pin and a copy of the current Bylaws and Booklet of Instruction. (See Section
