Keith E. Harman was elected Junior Vice Commander-in-Chief of the Veterans of Foreign Wars on July 22,2015, at the VFW's 116th National Convention, held in Pittsburgh, Pa.

Mr. Harman served in the U. S. Army from 1967-1969. He served in Vietnam as a Crew Chief and Door Gunner on Huey Helicopters. His decorations include the Air Medal, Army Commendation Medal, Vietnam Service Medal with two bronze service stars, Vietnam Campaign Medal, Republic of Vietnam Gallantry Cross with Palm Unit Citations, Good Conduct Medal, National Defense Service Medal and the Aircraft Crewmember Badge.

Mr. Harman joined the VFW in 1983 at Post 3035 in Delphos, Ohio, where he is a Gold Legacy Life Member. He has served in elected and appointed positions at the Post, District and Department (state) levels culminating with his election as Department Commander 2004-2005 in which he achieved All American status. On the national level, he has served on several committees, including Chairman of the National Veterans Service Committee.

He is a Life Member of the VFW National Home, Military Order of the Cootie, AMVETS, Disabled American Veterans, Vietnam Veterans of America, and a member of American Legion and Alpha Troop Alumni Association.

Mr. Harman is retired with 22 years of service as a County Veterans Service Officer. He attended Giffin Jr. College and Kansas State Teachers College.

He and his wife Mary Lou make their home in Delphos, Ohio. They have two children, Adam and Keri, and five grandchildren.

#### FLAG ETIQUETTE U.S. FLAG CODE U.S. FLAG HISTORY

The federal flag code says the universal custom is to display the U.S. flag from sunrise to sunset on buildings and stationary flagstaffs in the open, but when a patriotic effect is desired the flag may be displayed 24-hours a day if properly illuminated during the hours of darkness. Also, the U.S. flag should not be displayed when the weather is inclement, except when an all-weather flag is displayed.

#### **Displaying the Flag:**

#### **On Same Staff**

U.S. flag at peak, above any other flag.

#### Grouped

U.S. flag goes to its own right. Flags of other nations are flown at same height.

#### Marching

U.S. flag to marchers right (observer's left).

### **On Speaker's Platform**

When displayed with a speaker's platform, it must be above and behind the speaker. If mounted on a staff it is on the speaker's right.

#### Decoration

Never use the flag for decoration. Use bunting with the blue on top, then white, then red.

#### Salute

All persons present in uniform should render the military salute. Members of the armed forces and veterans who are present but not in uniform may render the military salute. All other persons present should face the flag and stand at attention with their right hand over the heart, or if applicable, remove their headdress with their right hand and hold it at the left shoulder, the hand being over the heart.

Over a Street Union (stars) face north or east depending on the direction of the street.

#### Half Staff

On special days, the flag may be flown at half-staff. On Memorial Day it is flown at half-staff until noon and then raised.

Do not let the flag touch the ground.

Do not fly flag upside down unless there is an emergency. Do not carry the flag flat, or carry things in it.

Do not use the flag as clothing.

Do not store the flag where it can get dirty.

Do not use it as a cover.

Do not fasten it or tie it back. Always allow it to fall free.

Do not draw on, or otherwise mark the flag.

#### Flag Disposal:

1. The flag should be folded in its customary manner.

2. It is important that the fire be fairly large and of sufficient intensity to ensure complete burning of the flag.

3. Place the flag on the fire.

4. The individual(s) can come to attention, salute the flag, recite the Pledge of Allegiance and have a brief period of silent reflection.

5. After the flag is completely consumed, the fire should then be safely extinguished and the ashes buried.

6. Please make sure you are conforming to local/state fire codes or ordinances

There is so much hustle and bustle this time of year with our youth programs well underway, well funded by our VFW posts and districts around

the state. I see Facebook posts of all the service we do for our veterans to make their lives just a bit better. It is the time of year when we start thinking about the holiday season just around the corner. At this time of year our thoughts turn to cold weather, homelessness, and needs that at times are almost more then bearable.

This article draws a Special Project that we as a VFW are in partnership with students from the Metro State University Flight team and CABA Collegiate Chapter. So what is CABA you ask? The Colorado Aviation Business Association has been gathering food and toys along the Front Range and Western Slope for 5 years. The donated goods were distributed by a group composed of pilots on the Precision Flying Team of Metro State University of Denver, private pilots and others who all donated their time and expenses to fly or drive the goods to VFW posts in Denver, Montrose, Delta, Alamosa, Trinidad and Burlington. Again this year they have scheduled the Christmas Charity Airlift event for Veterans. As of this writing, we are looking to add more drop areas. 4,200 hours was spent on this project. Raised from all contributions, 4000 pounds of toys and food. Air transportation and pilots donated \$34,500.00. There were 425 people involved including VFW members. No money was spent it was all donations.

We started collecting goods and money at the State Commander's homecoming in August. Funds continue to be sent in from posts for this project. We will be purchasing additional food and toys with the cash donations. The Department will be delivering our collections on Thursday, December 3, 2015 at the Wings Over the Rockies Museum. The keynote speaker is Col. Mark Tillman, Air Force One Captain from 2001-2009 talking about his role flying the nation's President as the 12<sup>th</sup> Presidential Pilot working under a "zero fail mission" philosophy. He will be telling the riveting, behind-the-scenes story of September 11, 2001 from his perspective at the controls of Air Force One, the day our nation changed forever.

Please collect your donations and deliver them to Department Headquarters no later than Monday, November 30, 2015. Thank you for your support of this veterans helping veterans Special Project.

1. RECRUIT 2. RETAIN

3. REINSTATE

Let's explore each one of the three R's.

RECRUIT - National, Department and District are always encouraging Posts to recruit new members. Several people to consider recruiting into VFW are: neighbors, postmen, policemen, sheriffs, firemen and anyone wearing a cap or shirt with military insignia on them. Just ask them if they were in the service and where they served.

RETAIN - We need to retain the new members that we bring into the posts. Start a mentor program and have a member communicate and keep in touch with the new members through e-mails, phone calls and text messages or any other form of communication the new member prefers. The continuous members need to be encouraged to become life members.

REI NST ATE - Members who have fallen through the cracks and have been taken off of the roster need to be contacted and encouraged to rejoin VFW. Department has a list of individuals who can be reinstated, as well as, a list of members at large that can be contacted.

This year, the Department of Colorado, needs 17,646 members to reach a goal of 100. 14,113 are life members, so 3,533 members need to be added to the membership from continuous, new and reinstated members. This is a goal that can be reached and make the Department of Colorado 100! Let's help Commander Pete "carry the load!"

There will not be a Colorado Veteran until after the first of the year, so I want to wish everyone a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.

Let's all work together to support and honor veterans!

I hope this finds everyone well and warm. I've noticed Post's are slowing down on updating, or finally creating by-laws. When being sent to Department for

review, we've noticed a few Post's mistake Article IV, Section 2 concerning "Admission fees". Admission fees are the fees you send to Department for each New member recruited. This amount is one dollar. These have nothing to do with your dues. If you look on the Quarterly Audit form, it is Line 2. Please read the sample By-Laws, which Department can supply, and call with any questions.

As I've gone over the Quarterly Audits for the past three years, and a very large majority are done correctly, a few have minor math problems, and some are just wrong. Not only is getting these audits

turned in on time required, doing them correctly is a must. We have several Post's in the Department who either did not do an audit, or just put some numbers on a page and turned it in. Then when a problem with funds arise, the bonding company would not cover the loss due to audit problems. Please take your time and do them correctly. Or better yet, go on line to vfwcolodept.org, the Department web site. Find the tab near the top named "Forms". Scroll down to the Quartermas-ters section and find the "Trustees (Fillable) Report of Audit Form." Fill in the blanks like you would on the paper form and it will automatically do the math. Print the form out, keep one for your Post, or District, and send the other to Department.

General Orders No. 2 November 1, 2015 Series: 2015-2016

1. Post & District Inspections should be completed by December 31, 2015. Send all three (3) copies to Department Headquarters for the Department Inspector to review. If he finds any irregularities he will confer with the State Commander and a letter of recommendation will be written to the Post Commander.

2. Section 709 of the VFW National By-Laws concerns Disposition of Real Property, i.e. Post Homes. Written notice of such proposal has first to be given to each member of said unit and the Department Commander ten (10) days prior to such regular or special meeting at which the proposal is to be considered, and then only by two-thirds (2/3) vote of approval of those present and voting at such regular or special meeting.

3. It is the obligation of every member to GET OUT AND VOTE for the candidates of their choice. Take a friend or friends with you to the voting place. Election day is November 3rd and you must be registered to exercise your right to vote.

4. Post Quartermaster and District Quartermaster Bonds expired August 31, 2015. Applications have been mailed to ALL Quartermasters for renewal. Please see that your Quartermaster is bonded in an amount equal to your Post liquid assets. This means ALL funds, Post, Club, Bingo, CD's, etc. Cost is \$4.50 per thousand.

5. Section 218, paragraph (11), Duty of Trustees, Trustees shall not be eligible to serve on committees or as officers whose books, records and accounts are audited by the Trustees. Among the duties of the three (3) elected Post Trustees, they shall: (duties are listed a - d).

Post Commanders and Post Trustees are reminded that the 2<sup>nd</sup> Post Trustee Report of Audit was due to be at Department Headquarters on October 25, 2015 to meet All State requirements. Please see your Post Quartermaster for forms and records.

6. Please be informed that any Post or District requesting a Department Officer to attend a VFW function should make such request in writing to the State Commander. Please allow sufficient time, at least three (3) weeks, for Department to make arrangements.

7. All VFW Posts are required to purchase the revised By-Laws and Ritual books from the VFW National Emblem and Supply Department. Please see your Post Quartermaster and ask him to order for you. All members should be informed that the Post Quartermaster has a current supply catalog and he is instructed to assist you with your order.

8. An annual income tax return (Form 990) is required of each Post, District and Men's Auxiliary exempt from tax under section 501 (c) 19 of the Federal Code. Starting in 2008 ALL VFW POSTS, DISTRICTS and MEN's AUXILIARIES with gross receipts of \$50,000 or less have to E-FILE, <u>EVERY YEAR</u>. All Posts exceeding \$50,000 in gross receipts must file on Form 990 or Form 990EZ. Forms and instructions are available from www. irs.gov.

Gross receipts include income from all sources, including membership dues, bar or restaurant receipts, etc. Some of this may be unrelated business income, in which case filing of Form 990-T may be required.

For 2014-2015, exempt organizations that are under section 501(c) and have gross receipts greater than \$50,000 but less than \$200,000 and assets less than \$500,000, may file Form 990-EZ instead of Form 990. If an organization eligible to submit the Form 990N or file the Form 990 EZ chooses to file the Form 990, it must file a complete return.

This return must be filed on or before the  $15^{\text{th}}$  day of the fifth month after the end of the accounting year (November 15 for June 30 year end or May 15 for calendar year end).

Request for extension of time to file may be made by submitting form 8868, Application for Extension of Time to File. If a Post, District or Men's Auxiliary fails to file the return on or before the due date, or the extended date, a penalty of \$20 for each day the return is late (not to exceed the smaller of \$10,000 or 5% of the gross receipts of the organization for the year) may be imposed, unless the organization can show that the late filing was due to reasonable cause.

If you do not file for three (3) consecutive years your Post, District or Men's Auxiliary will lose their non-profit standing with IRS and have to re-apply for non-profit standing and pay to file the application.

9. All Posts are reminded that they are responsible for filing of State Compensation Insurance, State and Federal Unemployment, State and Federal Withholding Tax and any local employee/employer tax, if you have one or more employees. All units of the Veterans of Foreign Wars in Colorado are NOT exempt from State Sales and Use Tax.

For a multitude of reasons, some Veterans have become endangered of losing their permanent housing or have lost it all together. The VFW is just one of forty-nine other agencies who partnered with the Mayors Challenge to End Veterans Homelessness. Ending Veteran Homelessness is quite a lofty goal indeed! However, this goal is attainable through the resources provided by the VA, HUD, local governments, plus the hard work of community service nonprofits just like the VFW. From the beginning of this year, the Mayors Challenge has housed a little more than 140 Homeless Veterans in Colorado.

• 1. Volunteer to help find home less Veterans in parks and camps under the supervision of your local Police Homeless Outreach team. Call the Volunteer Coordinator 719-722-4585 for further information and to volunteer.

• 2. Help build a *Home Starter Kit* from your Post's resources for a newly housed Veteran. The Home Starter Kit suggested item list is found at www. goo.gl/VwE4xF

This is your call, your faith in others can be one of the most rewarding projects you have taken part in as a VFW member!







Colorado VFW Members statistics for New and Reinstated members mirrors the national trends very closely. Without a change in the VFW Posts, the membership population will increasingly decline to the point where the VFW will have lost all its gains.

#### What's the trend?

Is the American Veteran population following the greater American trends? Are Veterans increasingly disconnecting themselves from family and friends; therefore not keeping up the community connections they have between, church, gyms, softball, bowling, et cetera, and Veterans Service Organizations? We believe so.

A recent discovery on membership we want you to know regards the new 40 year old Veteran you recruited this week. In his or her lifetime the Colorado Department will have a net membership gain of **Zero**; this means the VFW will lose effectiveness if we continue with business as usual. The Same Thing, Different Day Approach is not the answer.

#### **Reversing Trends**

What can we do to reverse these trends? Undoubtedly changes in the DNA of the Posts are needed. A growing number of Posts have already begun listening to potential member's needs and desires, while retaining the current members by keeping the Posts active.

• The often referred to management law; the 80/20 rule is true in all large organizations. Are we asking the 20% for too much while not finding the right people for the job out of the 80%?

• Can the declining VFW membership be attributed to the activities and the value given by the VFW?

• Have the leadership and members given creative thought to the Veterans who are eligible but not yet member's needs and desires?

• Is the Post engaged in community events?

• Could a market analysis of the community served help find out what the potential member's desires and needs are missing and assist you in changing the DNA?

Yes, an analysis of your Post's potential members can help you find and gain Veterans who want to become active in the VFW.

Review this simple model to build your own analysis.

1. Determine what is the area you want to focus upon and its demographics

2. Describe the population growth or decline of potential members,

3. Discover where Veterans are going

5. Discover where version and the find help and Comradeship, 4. Compare your finding of where Vet-erans are going to the capabilities of your Post, the Colorado Department, and the National organization,

5. Honestly compare how your Post performs a better job than the other organizations or if its deficient, brainstorm for ways to improve your operation, and

6. As you compare your Post to other similar organizations, write down your greatest Strengths and Weaknesses.

Use the knowledge you gained about the potential members and your Posts strengths and weaknesses as opportunities to change the DNA.

#### Unpaid members? They will come back

Chase after the potential reinstate members. You have a short window of opportunity to regain the trust they have lost and reverse the member's decision of non-participation in membership. Other membership driven organizations often report there is a short window of six to eight weeks before the member loses all interest and has cemented their decision of not returning as an active member. Hence if they have a need to become a member of a Veteran Service Organization, they will seek out one who fills their needs.

change is inevitable in the VFW The VFW has made significant changes in its lifetime. The culture of the VFW is to serve Veteran's needs. We must keep up with those needs and adapt to the needs of new Veterans, future Veterans, and our current Comrades. Reconnecting with these groups will help the VFW continue its mission and create greater strength as we advocate for all Veterans.

WELCOME all new eligible members both male and female to the VFW Auxiliary. We are so excited to have each of you as a part of this wonderful organization. I know your journey with the newly re-named VFW Auxiliary will be an experience you each will carry with you for generations to come. This new opportunity, to recruit male family members, to our organization will allow us to create many more opportunities for those who truly

want to help veterans and their families. By now all VFW Auxiliaries should have the new applications and are recruiting new members. You can download a single-page application from the National Organization's website or order the brochure using the fillable Brochure Order Form. Remember a couple of things regarding eligibility:

• If a person is eligible to join the VFW, then they are NOT eligible to join the Auxiliary. If you currently have a female VFW member who is also a VFW Auxiliary member she does NOT have to quit the Auxiliary. However, as of now you cannot sign up folks for dual membership into the VFW and VFW Auxiliary.

• If a Men's Auxiliary member wants to join your VFW Auxiliary they must fill out an application, be investigated, voted on and accepted just as you had to.

We need to get out the word about who the VFW Auxiliary is, what we do and how it helps our veterans and their families. We need to raise more public awareness about our organization and encourage those who are eligible to join us. The purpose of this program is to help Auxiliary members recruit new members and to retain our current members.

There are several training programs that can be provided to the Auxiliaries at the local or District level. These training sessions can be as short as 30 minutes such as a School of Instruction or more in-depth training for up to two hours. Some of the topics are "Why Membership Matters", "Handling and Overcoming Objectives", or "Engaging Your Auxiliary's Existing Members". In addition, there is a train-ing book, information handouts and other resources included.


