COLORADO VFW FOUNDATION

Thank you to the VFW Posts, VFW Auxiliaries, family members and friends for your donations. Every donation received makes a difference in the lives of Colorado's Veterans and their families.

The request for assistance has been slow to start this year. We thought we would be hit hard once our funding opened up. With the requests we have received this far and if the trend continues, we will be out of funds by the end of the year. We have had to reach out and coordinate the assistance with a couple of local VFW's and Auxiliaries.

Assistance Granted to date: July 1, 2020 through October 15, 2020, we have expended \$5,894.41 in assistance to 12 Veterans and their Families with Rent, Utilities, and Vehicle Repairs etc.....

Any eligible Veteran in need of emergency assistance across the State of Colorado can apply for a one time Grant of \$500. We receive referrals from and also refer Veterans to VA Social workers, Veterans Service Officers, and other non-profit organizations.

The Grant Application is available on the Department Website to download; follow the requirements and submit the application to our office.

We are asking you to remember Colorado's Veterans that are struggling and living paycheck to paycheck. We still need to help our Homeless Veterans and there are a lot of resources out there for them. How can we help the Veteran Population that is underserved? We can start by being understanding to some of their hardships; these are the veterans that are ashamed and feel like failures because they have to ask for help, they don't have VA Disability Benefits/VA Medical Benefits. They have full time jobs but the income and cost of living is that they are one emergency away from being homeless, they don't qualify for the other programs out there (they have income/they are not homeless) but

they don't have the ability to put money away into savings for an emergency or they had an emergency and used up their life savings. Yes we hear their stories and they are very thankful to receive the assistance we are able to provide.

Of the 12 veterans we have helped thus far one family is still on my mind. Veteran is employed (family of 5 Veteran, Wife and 3 children) shares rental home with two siblings- their plan was to split rent everyone save money build up credit and use VA home loan benefits to purchase a house. Due to Covid his wife lost her job- she is still waiting for her unemployment benefits- she tried food delivery to bring in extra money- well their only vehicle broke down and is now sitting- his siblings lost their jobs- they are looking for employment- in the meantime- Veteran had exhausted all of his savings- to keep the bills paid- he and his wife applied to agencies trying to get help with their rent only to be turned away for one reason or the other- bottom line they didn't qualify- He has incomethey are not homeless and the landlord has been gracious enough to work with them (no eviction/demand for possession) no daily late fees- but he needs the rent paid. This landlord was understanding- willing to work with us and willing to take partial payments from the Veteran, VFW Colorado Foundation, and any VFW Post or Auxiliary that would help. This family was so appreciative for the help they received and the additional assistance we were able to coordinate.

Sec 203 By-Laws states that if using virtual meeting then, that in no case shall the quorum be less than five (5) members, physically

Districts need to follow Sec 403 Bylaws, Quorum (b) The minimum number of delegates required to constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at a regular or special meeting shall not be less than one (1) delegate each from fifty (50) present of Posts in the District, provided that when using electronic attendance, at least twenty-five (25) present are physically present.

I hope that everyone within the Department of Colorado understands the challenges that both myself and the State President are going through to conduct needed business for the operation of both the Membership and the Auxiliary. I appreciate your understanding and flexibility to last minute changes, restrictions to attendance, and cancellations of the events we all enjoy attending. I also have to follow the same guidelines and with some reminders that it's about the health and safety of you our members.

Electronic Meetings

On 1 September the 12th edition of Robert's Rules of Order was published. Sections 9.30-9.36

cover electronic meetings. Electronic meetings, if allowed in the organization's by-laws, are permitted "so long as the meetings provide, at a minimum, conditions of opportunity for simultaneous aural communication among all participating members." Depending on what is written in the by-laws the meetings may be restricted to video conference as long as all participants can see each other as well as hear each other at the same time. It is not recommended that email. fax, chat room or written communication be allowed at an electronic meeting. A decision needs to be made if members not physically present have the right to participate. The organization having a unique access code for entry to the meeting helps with this problem. A central place should be decided on for the members choosing to participate in person. Electronic meetings must include adequate descriptions of how to participate. Other possible rules to include methods for determining a quorum, methods for seeking recognition, motions made in writing and how they are to be submitted and methods for taking and verifying votes. Also included in the updated Robert's are sample rules and suggest-

ed by-laws (pages 635-649). Four types of electronic meetings are covered: All Internet or combined Internet/telephone (aka Zoom); Telephone with Internet for conducting secret votes and sharing documents (aka Zoom); Speaker-phone and telephone only via telephone conference call. With all of these options some may be via Internet/telephone while others may be in the central location.

In re-writing your by-laws or adding an addendum it is easy to just say that electronic meetings are allowed. However, if you want specific provisions for voting or acknowledging participating members you might want to be more specific in your by-law change. Also if you want more members of your quorum to be present in the central location than on electronic methods you would need to include that number also. Of course bylaws may be changed at your annual convention (or Post meetings – see page 13 of the Congressional Charter) so if you start out open ended and decide later that the by-laws need to be more specific that is an option.

General Orders No. 2 Series: 2020-2021 November 1, 2020

- 1. Post & District Inspections should be completed by December 31, 2020. Give the Post their copy, District will keep their copy, and send Department's copy to Headquarters for the Department Inspector to review. If he finds any ir-regularities, he will confer with the State Commander and a letter of recommendation will be written to the Post Commander.
- 2. Section 709 of the VFW National By-Laws concerns Disposition of Real Property, i.e. Post Homes. Written notice of such proposal has first to be given to each member of said unit and the Department Commander ten (10) days prior to such regular or special meeting at which the proposal is to be considered, and then only by two-thirds (2/3) vote of approval of those present and voting at such regular or special meeting.
- 3. **GET OUT AND VOTE** for the candidates of your choice. Take a friend or friends with you to the voting place. Election Day is November 3rd and you must be registered to exercise your right
- 4. Post Quartermaster and District Quartermaster Bonds expired August 31, 2020. Applications have been mailed to ALL Quartermasters for renewal. Please see that your Quartermaster is bonded in an amount equal to your Post liquid assets. This means ALL funds, Post, Club, Bingo, CD's, etc. Cost is \$4.50 per thousand All Assessments had Officere that are sand. All Accountable Officers that are responsible for Post and District funds must be bonded. Bond applications and instructions are available on vfwco.org VFW Forms.
- 5. Section 218, paragraph (11), Duty of Trustees, Trustees shall not be eligible to serve on committees or as officers whose books, records and accounts are audited by the Trustees. Among the duties of the three (3) elected Post Trustees, they shall: (duties are listed a - d).

Post Commanders and Post Trustees are reminded that the 2nd Post Trustee Report of Audit is due to be at Department Headquarters by November 31, 2020 to meet All State requirements. Please see your Post Quartermaster for forms and

- 6. Please be informed that any Post or District requesting a Department Officer to attend a VFW function should make such request in writing to the State Commander. Please allow sufficient time, at least three (3) weeks, for Department to make arrangements.
- 7. All VFW Posts are required to have a current year By-Laws and Ritual. Need to order books from the VFW National Emblem and Supply Department. Please see your Post Quartermaster and ask him to order for you. All members should be informed that the Post Quartermaster has a current supply catalog and he is instructed to assist you with your order.
- 8. An annual income tax return (Form 990) is required of each Post, or District exempt from tax under section 501 (c) 19 of the Federal Code. Starting in 2008 ALL VFW POSTS, and DISTRICTS with gross receipts of \$50,000 or less have to E-FILE, EVERY YEAR. All Posts exceeding \$50,000 in gross receipts must file on Form 990 or Form

990EZ. Forms and instructions are avail-

able from www.irs.gov. Gross receipts include income from all sources, including membership dues, bar or restaurant receipts, etc. Some of this may be unrelated business income, in which case filing of Form 990-T may

be required.
For 2019-2020, exempt organizations that are under section 501(c) and have gross receipts greater than \$50,000 but less than \$200,000 and assets less than \$500,000, may file Form 990-EZ instead of Form 990.

If an organization eligible to submit the Form 990N or file the Form 990 EZ chooses to file the Form 990, it must file a complete return.

This return must be filed on or before the 15th day of the fifth month after the end of the accounting year (November 15 for June 30 year end or May 15 for calendar year end).

Request for extension of time to file may be made by submitting form 8868, Application for Extension of Time to File. If a Post, or District fails to file the return on or before the due date, or the extended date, a penalty of \$20 for each day the return is late (not to exceed the smaller of \$10,000 or 5% of the gross receipts of the organization for the year) may be imposed, unless the organization can show that the late filing was due to reasonable cause.

If you do not file for three (3) consecutive years your Post, or District will lose their non-profit standing with IRS and have to re-apply for non-profit standing and pay to file the application.

- 9. All Posts are reminded that they are responsible for filing of State Compensation Insurance, State and Federal Unemployment, State and Federal Withholding Tax and any local employee/employer tax if you have one or more employees.
- 10. <u>BUDDY POPPY:</u> The Buddy Poppy requirement for the National All-American program has been removed by the National Commander in Chief due to the shortage of Poppies. Department has also removed the requirement from the Centennial and All-State program as well. Can still get extra points for All-State for doing Buddy Poppy events.

1 1 . <u>C O U N C I L</u> <u>O F ADMINISTRATION:</u> The next Council of Administration meeting will be Sunday, March 21st, 2021. Joint Opening will be at 8:30 A.M. SHARP dependent on COVID-19 restrictions.

With regard to COVID, as of the writing of this article, it is on the rise again in Colorado. A link to the presentation I gave to the Council of Administration in October is available on the Department website. In the presentation are links to resources that will provide you with an up-to-date picture of COVID in each of your counties and in what level of restriction vou are in.

Also, protect yourself from a twindemic (the dual threat of a severe flu outbreak on top of the COVID-19 pandemic) and get your flu shot. If you are enrolled in the VA health care system you can go to any in-network pharmacy and receive a no-cost flu shot (standard or high-dose). To find the nearest pharmacy location you can use the following lookup tool: va.gov/find-locations

This will acknowledge their efforts and your support. We also plan to put together a list of dentists who are willing and eager to serve our veterans.

The Hero's Clinic specifically provides a wide variety of preventative and comprehensive dental care options. All the services are provided by senior dental students under the supervision of highly-qualified faculty and staff, many of whom are veterans themselves. Multiple pathways exist to provide free and reduced dental services.

Grants and funding for this special clinic are a constant challenge and Heroes Clinic lost one of their grants this last year. Our donations and contributions will be a welcome thing. It's important to note that our veterans do not qualify for dental support unless they are 100% service disabled. We have so many

veterans that are experiencing oral challenges that are expensive and financially beyond their means. This clinic works to support those veterans in need.

The clinic was established in 2014 in partnership with the generous support of Delta Dental of Colorado. They have treated 1300+ Colorado veterans in 32 counties and support veterans who themselves are dental students.

Oral health is so important for overall health. By improving our veteran's oral health, we can improve their general health and quality of life. This is such an important service and a responsibility that we must support and carry as supportive care for our veterans who so proudly and willingly served. This clinic has been featured in U.S. News & World Report, 9News, Denver 7, CBS4 Denver, KOSI, KYGO, KEPN and The Denver Post

- 3. No member will disrespect or embarrass any member of this organization at any time.
- 4. Department President Dee Chappell-Haley's Special Project is the Hero's Clinic. This clinic provides oral care for veterans as part of the CU School of Dental Medicine located on the Anschutz Medial Campus. Donations can be sent to the Department Treasurer.

 5. Suggested donations to Health and Happiness for National Home should be processed through MALTA or mailed directly to National Auxiliary Headquarters in Kansas City. Department Hospital donations should be mailed to Department Treasurer Cindy Anderson. Both donations are based on your June 30, 2020 membership number.
- 6. District Presidents and 6. Auxiliary Presidents: Please be sure that all Districts and Auxiliaries have filed their 990N or other appropriate 990 return by November 15, 2020. A copy of the acceptance confirmation for the 990N should be sent to the Department Treasurer, Cindy Anderson.
- 7. Standing Rules: In accordance with Section 211 of the National Bylaws, Auxiliaries and Districts may establish Standing rules to provide for specified operations, activities, events, expenses and disbursements between meetings provided such rules do not conflict with the National or Department Bylaws. Standing Rules should be reviewed an-
- nually.

 8. VOD and Patriot Pen Entries are due

 1. miss by October 31. to the Post/Auxiliaries by October 31, 2020. Judging of these entries at the Post/ Auxiliary level should be completed by November 15 and the results forwarded to the District. Judging at the District level should be completed, and winners forwarded to Department by December 15.

9. Change in Officers: Using the Officer Change Form, please notify National Headquarters and Department Secretary, Cindy Anderson of any changes in Auxiliary or District officers. National Headquarters must be notified of a change of the Treasurer. The above should also be notified in any changes of meeting dates, places, times, and dues amounts. This form is available on the Colorado Department website at vfw@

10. **District and Auxiliary Officers:** All Officers must hold a 2021 dues card or life membership card by December 31, 2020. Any officer or chairman who has not renewed their membership ceases to be a member in good standing on January 1, 2021 and cannot hold an office or chairmanship unless dues are paid.

- 11. Buddy Poppy Orders: Please place your orders for poppies with the Department of Colorado VFW, 1400 Carr St, Lakewood CO 80214. The minimum order is 500 poppies. If the Auxiliary and Post order together, be sure to note on the order form the amount purchased by each. Order forms can be found on the Department website at vfw@vfwco.org and in the Colorado Program Book.
- 12. Special Events: Please notify Department Secretary, Cindy Anderson of an upcoming special events and celebrations so that Department and District Officers may attend if available.
- 13. Auxiliary Treasurers: Membership Chairman Pat Garcia asks that you please process 2021 dues for continuous members at least weekly. Send all new, re-join and transfer applications to the Department Treasurer as soon as they have been accepted. Be sure that all applications are completely filled out and include the signatures of the investigating committee and the date elected.
- 14. District and Auxiliary Treasurers and Trustees: The second quarter audit for the period July 1, 2018 through September 30, 2020 should be completed by October 31. The audit must be accepted by motion within 60 days after the end of the quarter.
