History of Veterans Day

Veterans Day, formerly known as Armistice Day, was originally set as a U.S. legal holiday to honor the end of World War I, which officially took place on Nov. 11, 1918. In legislation that was passed in 1938, Nov. 11 was "dedicated to the cause of world peace and to be hereafter celebrated and known as 'Armistice Day." As such, this new legal holiday honored World War I veterans.

In 1954, after having been through both World War II and the Korean War, the 83rd U.S. Congress -- at the urging of veterans service organizations -- amended the Act of 1938 by striking out the word "Armistice" and inserting the word "Veterans." With the approval of this legislation on June 1, 1954, Nov. 11 became a day to honor American veterans of all wars.

In 1968, the Uniform Holiday Monday Act ensured three-day weekends for federal employees by celebrating four national holidays on Mondays: Washington's Birthday, Memorial Day, Veterans Day and Columbus Day. Under this bill, Veterans Day was moved to the fourth Monday of October. Many states did not agree with this decision and continued to celebrate the holiday on its original date. The first Veterans Day under the new law was observed with much confusion on Oct. 25, 1971.

Finally on Sept. 20, 1975, President

Finally on Sept. 20, 1975, President Gerald R. Ford signed a law that returned the annual observance of Veterans Day to its original date of Nov. 11, beginning in 1978. Since then, the Veterans Day holiday has been observed on Nov. 11.

Celebrating the Veterans Day Holiday

If the Nov. 11 holiday falls on a non-workday -- Saturday or Sunday -- the holiday is observed by the federal government on Monday (if the holiday falls on Sunday) or Friday (if the holiday falls on Saturday). Federal government closings are established by the U.S. Office of Personnel Management. State and local government closings are deter-

mined locally, and non-government businesses can close or remain open as they see fit, regardless of federal, state or local government operation determinations.

United States Senate Resolution 143, which was passed on Aug. 4, 2001, designated the week of Nov. 11 through Nov. 17, 2001, as "National Veterans Awareness Week." The resolution calls for educational efforts directed at elementary and secondary school students concerning the contributions and sacrifices of veterans.

Here is President Dwight Eisenhower's letter to Harvey V. Higley, administrator of Veterans' Affairs, designating him chairman of the Veterans Day National Committee:

The White House Office October 8, 1954

Dear Mr. Higley:

I have today signed a proclamation calling upon all of our citizens to observe Thursday, November 11, 1954 as Veterans Day. It is my earnest hope that all veterans, their organizations, and the entire citizenry will join hands to insure [sic] proper and widespread observance of this day. With the thought that it will be most helpful to coordinate the planning, I am suggesting the formation of a Veterans Day National Committee. In view of your great personal interest as well as your official responsibilities, I have designated you to serve as Chairman. You may include in the Committee membership such other persons as you desire to select and I am requesting the heads of all departments and agencies of the Executive branch to assist the Committee in its work in every way possible.

I have every confidence that our Nation will respond wholeheartedly in the appropriate observance of Veterans Day, 1954.

I loved my psychia-trist. He got me. He understood when I missed appointments it was because I didn't want to face my demons. He was patient in helping

me work through dilemmas to become stronger in confronting my fears. He wasn't judgmental. He wasn't forceful with his opinions or guidance. He knew when to talk and when to listen. And most importantly, he knew what it was going to take to get me back out into society and start living the life I knew before PTSD, including getting me assigned a service dog. He's since retired but I was blessed, truly truly blessed.

Fast forward to today, I still have my struggles but because of his foresight (insight) I've worked my way up to the position as Commander of the Dept. of CO VFW, something I would not have wanted to pursue prior to receiving Katy. Now I've accepted it as my mission to share that opportunity with as many Veterans as possible in hopes that they may be able to somewhat relive the life they knew before PTSD. It can't be kissed away and made all better like the booboos from our childhood but it can be confronted and worked through with some sort of normalization achieved. It's a hope that we have for all suffering Veterans.

After much discussion and whickering to formalize plans, my trusted Sr. Vice Cdr, John Keene, came up with a fabulous solution, to provide assistance to those currently suffering from PTSD by obtaining a service animal. We are developing a program called the "Katy Rimpley Service Animal Assistance Grant" that will provide financial support to Veterans who want a service animal in their life but cannot afford the numerous costs associated with such a responsibility.

This is how it will work: providing financial support for various costs including food, veterinary-required appointment assistance, one year insurance premium payment, and grooming supplies and/or appointments costs for those animals that have sanitary/health requirements. The organization that provides a service animal must be an ADA certified program. The specific amount of financial support is still in the infancy stage as the costs can vary from animal to animal, thus the need to obtain that information and come up with an average cost to be fair across the board.

This idea has been in my head for at least two years since meeting with Veterans from all over the state and hearing their financial restrictions as to why they don't have a service animal, which in turn restricts involvement within their own VFW posts. It's still a work in progress so any input regarding the program would be greatly appreciated to improve Veterans' livelihoods. Please email me directly at raftergllc@gmail.com with

VFW: Where Anything is Pawsible

Each year the National Society Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) awards multiple scholarships to students showing dedication to the pursuit of higher education in diverse areas of study including history, economics, law, political science, medicine, nursing, occupational and physical therapy, elementary and secondary education, chemistry, math, science and English.

Honoring Military Families Scholarship

- Awarded to a high school senior or undergraduate student who has been accepted to or attending a college or university and is the child of a parent who served or is serving in the United States Armed Forces.
- Applicant must provide documentation proving parentage, such as a birth certificate or adoption papers, and documentation proving their parent's service. The minimum award is \$1500.

DAR's scholarships are awarded and judged without regard to gender, race, color, religion, national origin, or disability.

- Applicants must be citizens of the United States.
- Applicants must attend or plan to attend an accredited college or university in the United States.
- All multi-year scholarships, typically renewable up to four years, must be for consecutive years of attendance.
- Awards are based on academic excellence, commitment to the field of study, and/or financial need, or other restrictions on specific scholarships.
- Awards are placed on deposit with the recipient's college or university and any unused portion shall be returned to the DAR.
- Applicants are only eligible to receive one scholarship from the DAR.

The DAR Scholarship Committee Now Has an Online Submission Process https:/dar.academicworks.com/

Emailed or mailed applications will no longer be accepted, unless applying for the Margaret Howard Hamilton Scholarship. The portal will open for the coming year, 2023, on November 1, 2022 through January 31, 2023 at 11:59 pm (Hawaii Time).

As the holidays approach, I would like everyone to consider taking advantage of the Uniting To Combat Hunger Grant that is available from the National VFW.

The criteria have changed slightly since last year, so please review the application carefully. The matching grant this year is a maximum of \$1500 and volunteer hours no longer count. But the award is still calculated as a dollar-for-dollar match or one dollar per pound of food donated. So, if your Post/ Auxiliary is planning any activities to address food insecurity among veterans you may be eligible for up to \$1500 in funds.

If you do not have a holiday meal or food drive planned, I encourage you to utilize the UTCH Grant to support the Colorado Aviation Business Association (CABA) Holiday Airlift. This is an annual event supported by the Department in which the CABA pilots deliver much needed food to VFW Posts throughout the State the first weekend of December.

If your Post sends a \$1500 donation

to Department HQ marked CABA in the memo line, I will work with your Post Quartermaster to submit a grant application to National to receive the matching funds. If you have questions ahead of time, give me a call at 303-547-7578.

Please be aware that the StillServing Grants have also changed since last year. The Community Support Grant did away with the ability to simply donate to a local charity, however you can still conduct a community outreach project and earn up to \$1500 to support it. The Post and Auxiliary can each apply for this grant independently. On the other hand, now only Districts can apply for the Corporate Partnership Grant.

In conclusion, continue getting out in the community and doing good things, but also keep in mind that there are resources available to help you make a bigger impact.

Quartermaster's Column **Bruce Dolan**



Greetings, I hope this finds all well.

Beginning the new calendar year a couple of items come to mind about staying current with the tax and nonprofit status of our Posts and Districts.

We have 87 Posts and 13 Districts. All are required to file taxes (990) each year along with your nonprofit declaration with the Secretary of State (SOS). You can go to IRS.gov to find the correct form and www.sos.state.

<u>co.us</u>. There are also numbers on the web sites if you would want to speak with and actual person.

We have 48 Posts and/or District that have not filed an SOS filing in a year or more and 45 Posts and/or Districts that have not filed a 990.

And now for the good news, you may have filed these forms but didn't send a copy to Headquarters so we can keep it on file. This has worked well for several Posts in the past as paper work has been misplaced or lost and Department has been able to replace it. So please keep current on these filings and send a copy to us and keep one for the Post or

If you have a change in Officers, please file a new election report. This is especially important if there is a change in Quartermaster. When National gets the election report, they will give access to the National website once a password is established. There is a lot of information for Quartermasters to learn from and work with on the website.

One last item for your quarterly audit. If you look at line 5 of the audit it notes Post Dues Reserve Fund. This is no longer required. The National Convention voted several years ago to do away with this for Posts. There is nothing to keep a Post from having one, but it may simplify your bookkeeping if you don't. Also, according to Section 219 of the National By-Laws, a Post WILL establish and maintain a Relief Fund. That is line 4 on the Quarterly Audit.

General Orders No. 2 November 1, 2022 Series: 2022-2023

- 1. Post & District Inspections should be completed by December 31, 2022. Send (1) copy to Department Headquarters for the Department Inspector to review. If he finds any irregularities, he will confer with the State Commander and a letter of recommendation will be written to the Post Commander.
- 2. Section 709 of the VFW National By-Laws concerns Disposition of Real Property, i.e. Post Homes. Written notice of such proposal has first to be given to each member of said unit at least ten (10) days prior to such regular or special meeting and at least 30 days to the Department Commander prior to the regular or special meeting, at which the proposal is to be considered. A two-thirds (2/3) vote of approval of those present and voting at such regular or special meeting.
- 3. It is the obligation of every member to GET OUT AND VOTE for the candidates of their choice. Take a friend or friends with you to the voting place. Election Day is November 8th and you must be registered to exercise your right
- 4. Section 218 (a) (11), Duty of Trustees, Trustees shall not be eligible to serve on committees or as officers whose books, records and accounts are audited by the

Post Commanders and Post Trustees are reminded that the 2^{nd} Post Trustee Report of Audit is due to Department Headquarters by October 25, 2022 to meet All State requirements. Please see your Post Quartermaster for forms and records.

- Mathew Cummings has been appointed as Department of Colorado VFW Service Officer as of October 16, 2022. If you are in need of a Service Officer call 303-914-5597 or 303-914-5595 and make an appointment.
- 6. Please be informed that any Post or District requesting a Department Officer to attend a VFW function should make such request in writing to the State Commander. Please allow sufficient time, at least three (3) weeks, for Department to make arrangements.
- 7. All VFW Posts are required to have the revised 2023-year By-Laws and Ritual books from the VFW National Emblem and Supply Department. Please see your Post Quartermaster and ask them to order for you. All members should be informed that the Post Quartermaster has a current supply catalog, and they can

assist you with your order. It can also be downloaded from the National VFW website at https://vfw.org/my-vfw/vfw- training-and-support/bylaws-trainingforms-and-templates for free.

8. An annual income tax return (Form 990) is required of each Post, or District exempt from tax under section 501 (c) 19 of the Federal Code. Starting in 2008 ALL VFW POSTS, and DISTRICTS with gross receipts of \$50,000 or less have to E-FILE, EVERY YEAR. All Posts exceeding \$50,000 in gross receipts must file on Form 990 or Form 990EZ. Forms and instructions are available from www.irs.gov.

Gross receipts include income from all sources, including membership dues, bar or restaurant receipts, etc. Some of this may be unrelated business income, in which case filing of Form 990-T may be required.

For 2018-2019, exempt organizations that are under section 501(c) and have gross receipts greater than \$50,000 but less than \$200,000 and assets less than \$500,000, may file Form 990-EZ instead of Form 990. If an organization eligible to submit the Form 990N or file the Form 990 EZ chooses to file the Form 990, it must file a complete return. This return must be filed on or before the 15th day of the fifth month after the end of the accounting year (November 15 for June 30 year end or May 15 for calendar year end).

Request for extension of time to file may be made by submitting form 8868, Application for Extension of Time to File. If a Post, or District fails to file the return on or before the due date, or the extended date, a penalty of \$20 for each day the return is late (not to exceed the smaller of \$10,000 or 5% of the gross receipts of the organization for the year) may be imposed, unless the organization can show that the late filing was due to reasonable cause.

If you do not file for three (3) consecutive years your Post, or District will lose their non-profit standing with IRS and have to re-apply for non-profit standing and pay to file the appli-

9. All Posts are reminded that they are responsible for filing of State Compensation Insurance, State and Federal Unemployment, State and Federal Withholding Tax and any local employee/employer tax, if you have one or more employees.

National Representative 123rd Founders Day Gala

Duane Sarmiento was elected Senior Vice Commander-in-Chief of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the U.S. on July 21, 2022, at the 123rd VFW National Convention in Kansas City, Missouri.

He served in the United States Navy from 1988 to 1997, and the United States Naval Reserve from 2002 to 2006, earning his VFW eligibility by serving in Operations Desert Shield/Storm. In recognition of his service, he received the Navy Achievement Medal, Navy Combat Action Ribbon, Navy Good Conduct Medal, the Southwest Asia Service Medal with three campaign stars, the Saudi Arabian Medal for the Liberation of Kuwait, Kuwait Medal for the Liberation of Kuwait and numerous other medals and ribbons. In 2003, he earned the title of the Naval Reserve Center Sailor of the Year at Fort Dix.

Duane joined the VFW in 1990 at

Post 5579 in Gibbstown, New Jersey, where he maintains his Gold Legacy



Life membership. He has served in elected and appointed positions at the Post, District and Department levels, culminating with his election as the VFW Department of New Jersey Commander from 2018 to 2019. On the national level, he served as the VFW Inspector General from 2019 to 2020, and served on the National Security and Foreign Affairs Committee, General Resolutions Committee, and as Special Aide-de-

He retired as a police officer with the Greenwich Township Police Department and Gloucester County Sheriff's Department in New Jersey. Duane was the director of Veterans Affairs in Gloucester County, New Jersey, retiring after 10 years of service.

He is a life member of the Military Order of the Cootie, at Ky-Yi Pup Tent #1 in Delaware, and a member of the Fleet Reserve Association, Branch 57.

Happy Fall Season. Hoping everyone had a good summer.

My focus in this Colorado Veteran Article, is to give more information of what we can do to help our Veterans.

Do you need a haircut or a trim? Why not visit "Sport Clips "which has been a primary supporter of the VFW's "Sport Clips Help a Hero Scholarship". The Scholarship program provides scholarships for service members and veterans to use at post-secondary schools and trade schools. They provide free haircuts to veterans and active-duty service members on Veterans Day, November 11th, and as well THEY donate \$2.00 for every haircut service provided on that day.

So many recipients have earned a variety of degrees including engineering, computer science, business accounting and many more

Scholarship Details: Scholarships of up to \$5,000 will be

awarded to qualified applicants.

• Awarded scholarships are limited to one per family per semester.
Applications for the fall semes-

ter will be accepted Jan. 1 through April 30.

Applications for the spring semester will be accepted Aug. 1 through Nov. 15.

Fall semester scholarships will be awarded in August, and spring semester scholarships will be awarded in January.

Scholarships must be used by the end of the school semester for which the veteran is applying or they will become null and void.

Scholarships are restricted for tuition and fees only and will be paid directly to accredited schools.

Eligible Applicants Must:

- Be a citizen of the United States.
- Be retired, honorably discharged, active duty, or a member of the National Guard or Reserve.
- Have completed Basic Training and follow-on training (Advanced Individual Training, technical school, etc.)
- Separated with or currently hold a military rank of E-5 or below. Demonstrate a need for financial as-
- Participate in, be accepted to or currently enrolled in a VA-approved program or school at an accredited post-secondary institution.

Unmet Needs:

Unmet Needs is there to help America's military families who have

run into unexpected financial difficulties because of deployment or other military-related activity or injury. The program provides financial aid grants of up to \$1,500 to assist with basic life needs in the form of a grant - not a loan - so no repayment is required. They pay the creditors directly so that they won't have to worry of contacting them. We know that there are military service members that need this help as they are probably having financial problems, so this is what they help them with. and help them in every way.

GENERAL ORDERS #2

All General Orders from the Department President are official and need to be read at the first meeting following receipt before being filed for reference.

- 1. Presidents on all levels are reminded that their duties in accordance with Section 810 of the National Bylaws are to preside and maintain order and enforce a strict observance of the Bylaws and ritual of the organization, appoint all officers and committees not otherwise provided for, see that there is no disruption during the meeting and if so, has the right to have the member causing the disruption removed.
- 2. Members should address all remarks to the President, not to other members in attendance. Members should stand and be recognized by the President and, if two stand at the same time, the President will decide who is recognized first.
- 3. No member will disrespect or embarrass any member of this organization at any time.
- 4. Department President Ron Boone **Special Project** is the Colorado Fisher House. Proceeds from the sale of the Veteran Pin and donations will go to support this fund.
- 5. Suggested donations to Health & Happiness should be processed through MÂLTA or mailed directly to National Auxiliary Headquarters in Kansas City. Department Hospital donations should be mailed to Department Treasurer Lennie Dolan. The Department Hospital donation is \$.75 per member. Both donations are based on your June 30, 2022, membership number.
- 6. District Presidents and Auxiliary Presidents: Please be sure that all Districts and Auxiliaries have filed their 990N or other appropriate 990 return by November 15, 2022. A copy of the acceptance confirmation for the 990N should be sent to Department Treasurer, Lennie Dolan.
- 7. Standing Rules: In accordance with Section 211 of the National Bylaws, Auxiliaries and Districts may establish Standing Rules to provide for specified operations, activities, events, expenses and disbursements between meetings provided such rules do not conflict with the National or Department Bylaws. Standing Rules should be reviewed an-
- 8. VOD and Patriot Pen Entries are due to the Post/Auxiliaries by October 31, 2022. Judging of these entries at the Post/Auxiliary level should be completed by November 15 and the results forwarded to the District. Judging at the District level should be completed, and winners forwarded to Department by December 15, 2022.
- 9. Change in Officers: Using the Officer Change Form, please notify National Headquarters and Department Secretary Linda Reinpold of any changes in Auxiliary or District Officers. National Headquarters must be notified of a change of the Treasurer. The above should also be notified of any changes of meeting dates, places, times and dues

amounts. This form is available on the Colorado Department website at www. vfwco.org.

- 10. District and Auxiliary Officers: All officers must hold a 2023 dues card or life dues card by December 31, 2022. Any officer or chairman who has not renewed their membership eases to be a member in good standing on January 1, 2023, and cannot hold an office or chairmanship unless dues are paid.
- 11. Buddy Poppy Orders: Please place your orders for poppies with the Department of Colorado VFW, 1400 Carr Street, Lakewood CO 80214. The minimum order is 500 poppies. If the Auxiliary and Post order together, be sure to note on the order form the amount purchased by each. Order forms can be found on the Department website at www.vfwco.org and in the Colorado Program Book.
- 12. Special Events: Please notify Department Secretary Linda Reinpold of an upcoming special event or celebration so that the Department and District Officers may attend if available.
- 13. Auxiliary Treasurers: Membership Chairman Raymond Moelder asks that you please process 2023 dues for continuous members at least weekly. Send all new, rejoin and transfer applications to the Department Treasurer as soon as they have been accepted. Be sure that all applications are filled out and include the signatures of the investigating committee and the date elected.
- 14. District and Auxiliary Treasurers and Trustees: The second quarter audit for the period July 1, 2022, through September 30, 2022, should be completed by October 31. The audit must be accepted by motion within 60 days after the end of the quarter.
- 15. District Dues are to be remitted to the District Treasurer by September 30, 2022, of the current Auxiliary year or as established by the District Standing Rules based on the June 30 membership of the preceding year.
- 16. A Special Thank You to all of those who attended the Parade of Programs. The Program Chairmen did an exceptional job of promoting their programs and in providing information. Also, a special thank you to the Council Members and Auxiliary members who attended the Council Meeting on August 21, 2022. Remember that all members are encouraged to attend these events.

Our local Fisher House has 16 suites and can accommodate 16 to 32 family members. It features a large kitchen, laundry facilities, a spacious dining room and an inviting living room with a library. Our new home also has an elevator to easily access the second floor.
