Veterans Day November 11th

Veterans Day (originally known as Armistice Day) is a federal hol-iday in the United States observed annually on November 11, for honoring military veterans of the United States Armed Forces (who were discharged under conditions other than dishonorable). It coincides with other holidays including Armistice Day and Remembrance Day which are commemorated in other countries that mark the anniversary of the end of World War I. Major hostilities of World War I were formally ended at the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month of 1918 when the Armistice with Germany went into effect. At the urging of major U.S. veteran organizations, Armistice Day was renamed Veterans Day in 1954.

Veterans Day is distinct from Memorial Day, a U.S. public holiday in May. Veterans Day commemorat-ed the service of all U.S. veterans, while Memorial Day honors those who have died while in military service. Another military holiday that also occurs in May, Armed Forces Day, honors those currently serving in the U.S. military. Additionally, Women Veterans Day is recognized by a growing number of U.S. states that specifically honor women who have served in the U.S. military.

History

On November 11, 1919, President Woodrow Wilson issued a message to his countrymen on the first Armistice Day, in which he expressed what he felt the day meant to Americans:

A year ago today our enemies laid down their arms in accordance with an armistice which rendered them impotent to renew hostilities, and gave to the world an assured opportunity to reconstruct its shattered order and to work out in peace a new and more just set of international relations. The soldiers and people of the European Allies had fought and endured for more than four years to uphold the barrier of civilization against the aggressions of armed force. We ourselves had been in the conflict something more than a year and a half.

With splendid forgetfulness of mere personal concerns, we remodeled our industries, concentrated our financial resources, increased our agricultural output, and assembled a great army, so that at the last our power was a decisive factor in the victory. We were able to bring the vast resources, material and moral, of a great and free people to the assistance of our associates in Europe who had suffered and sacrificed without limit in the cause for which we fought.

Out of this victory there arose new possibilities of political freedom and economic concert. The war showed us the strength of great nations acting together for high purposes, and the victory of arms foretells the enduring conquests which can be made in peace when nations act justly and in furtherance of the common interests of men.

To us in America the reflec-tions of Armistice Day will be filled with solemn pride in the heroism of those who died in the country's ser-vice, and with gratitude for the vic-tory, both because of the thing from which it has freed us and because of the opportunity it has given America to show her sympathy with peace and justice in the councils of nations.

The United States Congress ad-opted a resolution on June 4, 1926, requesting that President Calvin Coolidge issue annual proclamations calling for the observance of November 11 with appropriate ceremonies. A Congressional Act (52 Stat. 351; 5 U.S. Code, Sec. 87a) approved May 13, 1938, made November 11 in each year a legal holiday: "a day to be dedicated to the cause of world peace and to be thereafter celebrated and known as 'Armistice Day'".

In 1945, World War II veteran Raymond Weeks from Birmingham, Alabama, had the idea to expand Armistice Day to celebrate all veterans, not just those who died in World War I. Weeks led a delegation to Gen. Dwight Eisenhower, who support-ed the idea of National Veterans Day. Weeks led the first national celebra-tion in 1947 in Alabama and annually until his death in 1985. President Reagan honored Weeks at the White House with the Presidential Citizenship Medal in 1982 as the driving force for the national holi-day. Elizabeth Dole, who prepared the briefing for President Reagan, determined Weeks as the "Father of Veterans Day".

US Representative Ed Rees from Emporia, Kansas, present-ed a bill establishing the holiday through Congress. President Dwight D. Eisenhower, also from Kansas, signed the bill into law on May 26, 1954. It had been eight and a half years since Weeks held his first Armistice Day celebration for all veterans.

Congress amended the bill on June 1, 1954, replacing "Armistice" with "Veterans," and it has been known as Veterans Day since.

The National Veterans Award was also created in 1954. Congressman Rees of Kansas received the first National Veterans Award in Birmingham, Alabama, for his support in offering legislation to make Veterans Day a federal holiday.

Although originally scheduled for celebration on November 11 of every year, starting in 1971 in ac-cordance with the Uniform Monday cordance with the Uniform Monday Holiday Act, Veterans Day was moved to the fourth Monday of October (October 25, 1971; October 23, 1972; October 22, 1973; October 28, 1974; October 27, 1975; October 25, 1976, and October 24, 1977). In 1978, it was moved back to its orig-inal celebration on November 11. While the legal holiday remains on November 11, if that date happens to be on a Saturday or Sunday, then to be on a Saturday or Sunday, then federal government employees and a number of organizations will in-stead take the day off on the adjacent Friday or Monday, respectively.

Observance

Because it is a federal holiday, some American workers and many students have Veterans Day off from work or school. When Veterans Day falls on a Saturday then either Saturday or the preceding Friday may be designated as the holiday, whereas if it falls on a Sunday it is typically observed on the following Monday. When it falls on the weekend many private companies offer it as a floating holiday where employees can choose some other day.[ci-tation needed] A Society for Human

Resource Management poll in 2010 found that 21 percent of employ-ers planned to observe the holiday in 2011.

Legally, two minutes of silence is recommended to be observed at 2:11pm Eastern Standard Time.

Non-essential federal government offices are closed. No mail is delivered. All federal workers are paid for the holiday; those who are required to work on the holiday sometimes receive holiday pay for that day in addition to their wages.

Armistice Day

Armistice Day In his Armistice Day address to Congress, Wilson was sensitive to the psychological toll of the lean War years: "Hunger does not breed reform; it breeds madness," he re-marked. As Veterans Day and the birthday of the United States Marine Corps (November 10, 1775) are only Corps (November 10, 1775) are only one day apart, that branch of the Armed Forces customarily observes both occasions as a 96-hour liberty period.[citation needed]

Election Day is a regular work-ing day, while Veterans Day, which typically falls the following week, is a federal holiday. The National Commission on Federal Election Reform called for the holidays to be merged, so citizens can have a day off to vote. They state this as a way to honor voting by exercising demo-cratic rights.

Spelling of Veterans Day While the holiday is commonly printed as Veteran's Day or Veterans' Day in calendars and advertisements, the United States Department of Veterans Affairs website states that the attributive (no apostrophe) rather than the possessive case is the official spelling "because it is not a day that 'belongs' to veterans, it is a day for honoring all veterans.



I hope this finds everyone well. Especially our mountain Comrades. There seems to be some confusion over fil-

ing claims for the Ralph Emerson/ Jack Gulden Memorial Blood/Cancer Fund reimbursement. These funds are to be to be used for out of pocket expenses for treatments of blood disorders or cancer treatments. You may apply once every 2 years with a maximum of 2 times for a grant of up to \$500. We must have receipts accompany the request. This also includes reimbursement for travel for gas for which a fuel receipt must be submitted. If you have any questions, please contact Headquarters at 303-421-1630, M-F 8am to 3pm.

Now is the time for Posts to clean up their rosters. Contact members you have not heard from in a while and see if they still have the same address, etc. If they are deceased, we need to remove them front the rosters as soon as possible. VFW Donor Services Department sends a message of condolence to the

family which always helps. The reason for doing this as soon as you can, there is nothing worse than to receive a sympathy card 6 to 12 months afterwards. Also, please check on older members. National now contacts a data base to find out if a member who is up there in age is still around. It is easier for the Post to do this and not find a shock when looking at memstats.

If you are member and are aware of another member moving, you need to contact a Post Officer to make the Post aware. Members have the responsibility to let the Post know their information is current. There is even a space in the Online Membership System for "snowbird" addresses. This is something new in the last few years, so if you know of someone who moves south for the winter, ask them to contact their Post so they can get communications and not have mail returned.

General Orders No. 2 November 1, 2022 Series: 2023-2024

1. Post & District Inspections should be completed by December 31, 2023. Send (1) copy to Department Headquarters for the Department Inspector to review. If he finds any irregularities, he will confer with the State Commander and a letter of recommendation will be written to the Post Commander.

2. Section 709 of the VFW National By-Laws concerns Disposition of Real Property, i.e. Post Homes. Written notice of such proposal has first to be given to each member of said unit at least ten (10) days prior to such regular or special meeting and at least 30 days to the Department Commander prior to the regular or special meeting, at which the proposal is to be considered. A two-thirds (2/3) vote of approval of those present and voting at such regular or special meeting.

3. It is the obligation of every member to GET OUT AND VOTE for the candidates of their choice. Take a friend or friends with you to the voting place. Election Day is November 7th and you must be registered to exercise your right to vote.

4. Section 218 (a) (11), Duty of Trustees, Trustees shall not be eligible to serve on committees or as officers whose books, records and accounts are audited by the Trustees.

Post Commanders and Post Trustees are reminded that the 2nd Post Trustee Report of Audit is due to Department Headquarters by October 25, 2023 to meet All State requirements. Please see your Post Quartermaster for forms and records.

5. Please be informed that any Post or District requesting a Department Officer to attend a VFW function should make such request in writing to the State Commander. Please allow sufficient time, at least three (3) weeks, for Department to make arrangements.

6. All VFW Posts are required to have the revised 2024-year By-Laws and Ritual books from the VFW National Emblem and Supply Department. Please see your Post Quartermaster and ask them to order for you. All members should be informed that the Post Quartermaster has a current supply catalog, and they can assist you with your order. It can also be downloaded from the National VFW website at https:// vfw.org/my-vfw-training-and-support/ bylaws-training-forms-and-templates for free.

7. An annual income tax return (Form 990) is required of each Post, or District exempt from tax under section 501 (c) 19 of the Federal Code. Starting in 2008 ALL VFW POSTS, and DISTRICTS with gross receipts of \$50,000 or less have to E-FILE, EVERY YEAR. All Posts exceeding \$50,000 in gross receipts must file on Form 990 or Form 990EZ. Forms and instructions are available from www. irs.gov.

Gross receipts include income from all sources, including membership dues, bar or restaurant receipts, etc. Some of this may be unrelated business income, in which case filing of Form 990-T may be required.

Exempt organizations that are under section 501(c) and have gross receipts greater than \$50,000 but less than \$200,000 and assets less than \$500,000, may file Form 990EZ instead of Form **990.** If an organization eligible to submit the Form 990N or file the Form 990EZ chooses to file the Form 990, it must file a complete return.

This return must be filed on or before the 15^{th} day of the fifth month after the end of the accounting year (November 15 for June 30 year end or May 15 for calendar year end).

Request for extension of time to file may be made by submitting form 8868, Application for Extension of Time to File. If a Post, or District fails to file the return on or before the due date, or the extended date, a penalty of \$20 for each day the return is late (not to exceed the smaller of \$10,000 or 5% of the gross receipts of the organization for the year) may be imposed, unless the organization can show that the late filing was due to reasonable cause.

If you do not file for three (3) consecutive years your Post, or District will lose their non-profit standing with IRS and have to re-apply for non-profit standing and pay to file the application.

8. All Posts are reminded that they are responsible for filing of State Compensation Insurance, State and Federal Unemployment, State and Federal Withholding Tax and any local employee/employer tax, if you have one or more employees.

The Role and responsibility of a District Chaplain: Manual of Procedure, page 84 states, "During the annual District Convention, the District Chaplain shall see that a fitting tribute is paid to our departed comrades. The Chaplain shall perform such other duties as may be incident to the office or as may from time to time be required

The American flag has a long history, and the members of our organization have spent nearly as long defending and honoring our nation's most iconic symbol of freedom. Whether you're looking for the historic details of how the U.S. flag came to be, or the rules and regulations that encompass her daily flight, we're here to ensure you can find the information you need.

Displaying the Flag

On Same Staff U.S. flag at peak, above any other flag.

Grouped

U.S. flag goes to its own right. Flags of other nations are flown at same height.

Marching

U.S. flag to marchers right (observer's left).

On Speaker's Platform

When displayed with a speaker's platform, it must be above and behind the speaker. If mounted on a staff it is on the speaker's right.

Decoration

Never use the flag for decoration. Use bunting with the blue on top, then white, then red.

Salute

All persons present in uniform should render the military salute. Members of the armed forces and veterans who are present but not in uniform may render the military salute. All other persons

by the laws and usage of this organization or lawful orders from proper authority.'

The District Chaplain should take the lead and reach-out and attempt to establish a collaborative relationship with each of the Post Chaplains within their district. Developing relationships takes time. Begin by calling each Post Chaplain in your district. Be genuine and honest. First introduce yourself and then explain that you recently learned that as District Chaplain you want to make yourself available to support and help them, if and when they may need it. Ask them how they are doing and try to find out how they view their role and responsibility as a Post Chaplain.

- Be available to answer questions and provide advice when appropriate.
- Help them become familiar with the resources that are available at vfwpa.org.
- Respond to e-mails and texts in a timely fashion when questions are asked.
- Encourage them to attend the district meeting and set a time to meet with them.

In almost every organization, and particularly within the Veterans of Foreign Wars, those in leadership positions are expected to work with those under them to provide support and encouragement, serving as their "coach" or "mentor."

Flag Etiquette

present should face the flag and stand at attention with their right hand over the heart, or if applicable, remove their headdress with their right hand and hold it at the left shoulder, the hand being over the heart.

Over a Street Union (stars) face north or east depending on the direction of the street.

Half Staff

On special days, the flag may be flown at half-staff. On Memorial Day it is flown at half-staff until noon and then raised.

Special Rules

Do not let the flag touch the ground. Do not fly flag upside down unless there is an emergency.

Do not carry the flag flat, or carry things in it.

Do not use the flag as clothing. Do not store the flag where it can get

dirty. Do not use it as a cover.

Do not fasten it or tie it back. Always allow it to fall free.


Do not draw on, or otherwise mark the flag.

Illumination Guidelines

Per Federal Flag Code, Section 2, paragraph (a), it is the universal custom to display the flag only from sunrise to sunset on buildings and on stationary flagstaffs in the open. However, when a patriotic effect is desired, the flag may be displayed twenty-four hours a day if properly illuminated during the hours of darkness.

You haven't been feeling like yourself or you are going for your annual checkup or you have found something somewhere that shouldn't be there. Sounds pretty routine until you get the diagnosis that you have Cancer. Doesn't make any difference what kind, what stage, where it is, your age. You have Cancer! Now the change in your life and pocketbook starts.

It has been said that insurance pays the bills. If you are very lucky that may be true. Many of us have private insurance or Medicare Advantage that have an out of pocket yearly maximum or copays which can be substantial for the average person. No one has a Cancer savings account.

The Ralph Emerson Jack Gulden Memorial Blood/Cancer Fund can help with the expenses, OUT OF POCKET, paid by our Colorado VFW and VFW Auxiliary members. What are some of the expenses covered:

Over the counter medications to have at home for reaction to treatment or to take prior to treatment. Your doctor will give you what to have on hand at home. Keep Your Receipts and be prepared to provide an explanation

Gas Receipts to get to chemotherapy, radiation etc. Gas is expensive. Trips to the infusion center or radiation center can be expensive especially if you have multiple trips in a week or multiple weeks of treatment. There are other tests, procedures your doctor will want throughout your treatment to monitor your Cancer. Keep Your Receipts Row C1 – Mama Cass Row C2 – Aretha Franklin Row C3 – Janet Jackson Row C4 – Brenda Lee

Row D1 – Our State President, Phil Reinpold Row D2 – Dick Clark Row D3 – Johnny Cash

VFW Auxiliary Outreach Frequently Asked Questions

1. Q.: Every year my Auxiliary participates in a walk in our area that raises awareness about suicide prevention. Members walk in the event and donate \$100 to the organization. Can the number of hours and members who walked in the event count toward Auxiliary Outreach?

A.: This is a great team-building activity for your Auxiliary, however, walking or running in an event/race may not be reported under Auxiliary Outreach. This example may be reported under Veterans & Family Support as that's where Veteran & Military Suicide Awareness and Prevention falls.

2. Q.: Members of a local Auxiliary were asked to sit on their county board to help raise money and volunteer to work at a dedication of a memorial that honors veterans. Since it was not a VFWor VFW Auxiliary-sponsored event, can this be reported under Auxiliary Outreach?

A.: No, it cannot be reported under Auxiliary Outreach. It's for veterans and the betterment of the community, therefore, it should be reported under Americanism.

3. Q.: A few of the ways listed to participate in Auxiliary Outreach involve youth. Wouldn't this be reported under the Auxiliary's Youth Activities Program?

A.: It depends on the project. For example, if you are putting on a patriotic program at a school with your Auxiliary, that is reported under Americanism and/or Youth Activities. If your Auxiliary volunteers with the Girl Scouts or Boy Scouts to teach them the Folds of the Flag, that is reported under Americanism and/or Youth Activities. If your Auxiliary partners at the Boys & Girls Club to tutor a group of kids, that is reported under Auxiliary Outreach.

4. Q.: Our Auxiliary purchases and delivers turkeys for a food pantry every Thanksgiving. Does this get reported under Auxiliary Outreach?

A.: No, it does not. Dropping off turkeys for a Thanksgiving meal is not the same as volunteering time in the food pantry organizing food, serving meals, bussing tables, etc. 5. Q.: Our Auxiliary partners with another organization to host a sock collection at our local

Walmart. Does this qualify as Auxiliary Outreach?

A.: It depends. If you stay and man the collection, then yes. If you drop off a collection bin and leave, then no.

If you are unsure of whether your project will count toward the Auxiliary Outreach Program, contact your Department Chairman with your questions.

All General Orders from the Department President are official and need to be read at the first meeting following receipt before being filed for reference.

1. Presidents on all levels are reminded that their duties in accordance with Section 810 of the National Bylaws are to preside and maintain order and enforce a strict observance of the Bylaws and ritual of the organization, appoint all officers and committees not otherwise provided for, see that there is no disruption during the meeting and if so, has the right to have the member causing the disruption removed.

2. Members should address all remarks to the President, not to other members in attendance. Members should stand and be recognized by the President and, if two stand at the same time, the President will decide who is recognized first.

3. No member will disrespect or embarrass any member of this organization at any time.

4. Department President Phil Reinpold's Special Project is Operation Veteran Strong. Proceeds from the sale of the Veteran Pin and donations will go to support this fund.

5. Suggested donations to Health & Happiness should be processed through MALTA or mailed directly to National Auxiliary Headquarters in Kansas City earmarked for Health and Happiness . Department Hospital donations should be mailed to Department Treasurer Lennie Dolan. The suggested Department Hospital donation is \$.75 per member. Both donations are based on your June 30, 2023, membership number.

6. District Presidents and Auxiliary Presidents: Please be sure that all Districts and Auxiliaries have filed their 990N or other appropriate 990 return by November 15, 2023. A copy of the acceptance confirmation for the 990N should be sent to Department Treasurer, Lennie Dolan.

7. Standing Rules: In accordance with Section 211 of the National Bylaws, Auxiliaries and Districts may establish Standing Rules to provide for specified operations, activities, events, expenses, and disbursements between meetings provided such rules do not conflict with the National or Department Bylaws. Standing Rules should be reviewed annually.

8. VOD and Patriot Pen Entries are due to the Post/Auxiliaries by October 31, 2023. Judging of these entries at the Post/Auxiliary level should be completed by November 15 and the results forwarded to the District. Judging at the District level should be completed, and winners forwarded to Department by December 15, 2023.

9. Change in Officers: Using the Officer Change Form, please notify National Headquarters and Department Secretary Cindy Anderson of any changes in Auxiliary or District Officers. The above should also be notified of any changes of meeting dates, places, times,

and dues amounts. This form is available on the Colorado Department website at www.vfwco.org.

10. District and Auxiliary Officers: All officers must hold a 2024 dues card or life dues card by December 31, 2023. Any officer or chairman who has not renewed their membership eases to be a member in good standing on January 1, 2024, and cannot hold an office or chairmanship unless dues are paid.

11. Buddy Poppy Orders: Please place your orders for the new Metal Poppy and the Original Red Cloth Poppy with the Department of Colorado VFW, 1400 Carr Street, Lakewood CO 80214. The minimum order is 500 poppies. If the Auxiliary and Post order together, be sure to note on the order form the amount purchased by each. There are now two Poppy Order forms that can be found on the Department website at <u>www.vfwco.</u> org and in the Colorado Program Book. Please be sure to use the correct form for the style you are ordering. Poppies can be ordered by the Auxiliaries but must include a VFW members membership number on the order. You must include freight in your payment as required per the order form.

12. Special Events: Please notify Department Secretary Cindy Anderson of an upcoming special event or celebration so that the Department and District Officers may attend if available.

13. Auxiliary Treasurers: Membership Chairman Lucille Chavez asks that you please process 2024 dues for continuous members at least weekly. Send all new, rejoin and transfer applications to the Department Treasurer as soon as they have been accepted. Be sure that all applications are filled out and include the signatures of the investigating committee and the date elected.

14. District and Auxiliary Treasurers and Trustees: The second quarter au-dit for the period July 1, 2023, through September 30, 2023, should be complet-ed by October 31. The audit must be accepted by motion within 60 days after the end of the quarter and a copy sent to the Department Treasurer.

15. District Dues are to be remitted to the District Treasurer by September 30, 2023, of the current Auxiliary year or as established by the District Standing Rules based on the June 30 membership of the preceding year.

16. A Special Thank You to all of those who attended the Parade of Programs. The Program Chairmen did an exceptional job of promoting their pro-grams and in providing information. Also, a special thank you to the Council Members and Auxiliary members who attended the Council Meeting on August 20, 2023. Remember that all members are encouraged to attend these events.

President's Special Project "Operation Veteran Strong"

Greetings!

The months are speeding by fast and fall and the holidays are upon us. Now is the time for our Auxiliaries to be active in supporting our Veterans.

September was Suicide Awareness Month and has always been something that I supported but didn't really realize the impacts until I experienced it myself. In December of 2022, I had a dear friend commit suicide in my front yard. I still have no idea why and I wonder what I could have done to possibly prevent it or help in some way. I found myself reaching out to Phil's Special Project, Operation Veteran Strong, as a veteran's family member for help. For anyone who has experienced a suicide of a friend or family member, it is traumatic. This great organization also has help and resources for family members who are seeking resources to combat the many questions suicide leaves behind.

We, as a nation, are losing our Veterans by Suicide at an average of 22 a day. This includes Veterans that are just returning home and can't cope with returning to civilian life and our World War II, Korean and Vietnam Veterans. Operation Veteran Strong has free help for them and their families.

Operation Veteran Strong is a Colorado based non-profit set up as a useful tool just for U.S. Veterans navigating civilian life. They (and you) can find inspiring stories from other Veterans, information on accessing benefits, helpful self-assessments, and a wide range of free, innovative and practical support services. This help to our Veterans is 100% FREE and confidential.

Here, at Operation Veteran Strong, Veterans get the tools they need to get things done. With their free, confidential account, they can connect on their own terms with: Veteran benefits, VSO contacts, outdoor recreation, employment, financial support, education, family and spouse supports, vet groups, VFW's, community support, and so much more. And most importantly both medical and non-medicalized solutions for Veterans returning to civilian life. They also specialize in mental health programs and help with Suicide Awareness.

You can purchase these beautiful purple and teal ribbon pins, with the Auxiliary emblem in the middle. The pin's colors are from the suicide prevention ribbon. They signify hope and courage for those who have attempted suicide and remembrance for those who lost their battle. They truly represent Phil's special project that is dear and true to him – Suicide Awareness by proving "WE VALUE EVERY VETERAN."

You can order these beautiful pins by mailing an order (located in this Veteran) along with the monies to pay for the requested number of pins. Once I receive the order form, I will send your requested number of pins to you via USPS. The cost per pin is \$3 and you are allowed to resell the pins for \$3. If you resell the pins at a higher cost, you are required to send the extra monies into Department of Colorado VFW Auxiliary. All monies raised from this pin are to go to Operation Veteran Strong.

I'm also challenging each and every Auxiliary member to give \$12 (a dollar a month) to support Operation Veteran Strong. My small Auxiliary has 60 members – that would equal \$720!! Just imagine how much we could donate if we just gave up one coke or one coffee a month!


