Freedom because of Bravery:

My first taste of American Pride" was when I was 12, at the grocery store with my mom. We went to the food court for dinner, and noticed an elderly man with a WW II veteran's cap on. We approached him and introduced ourselves, and as I shook his hand, my heart swelled with pride. I was proud of my country. I was proud of the man whose strong hand was wrapped around mine. I was proud of the men and women who represented America by joining the armed forces. I'll never lose this pride. I will always be a patriot, a lover of the red, white, and blue, and an admirer of our veterans.

Our national anthem calls America the land of the free and the home of the brave, but America can only be free if she is brave. Economics tell us that nothing is free. There's no such thing as a free lunch-everything must be bought with a price. The same is true of freedom; our veterans have bravely sacrificed everything to pay the price for freedom. Courageous men and women like the one I met at the grocery store are the reason that America can still be free.

Throughout history, in wars like Vietnam, World War II, Afghanistan, and Iraq, our love for freedom has been tested. Enemies of liberty have sought to snuff out the light. However, proud representatives of America have ventured through jungles where armed enemies lurked in the unknown

ready to strike and disappear. They have charged onto beaches under heavy machine gun and artillery fire where they knew they probably wouldn't make it out alive. They have colored the ocean red with their blood-shed for the liberty of people they will never meet. Thanks to them, my family can go to church on Sunday. Thanks to our veterans, I have no fear of being caught praying. Thanks to our veterans, I can say what I want, when I want, and where I want; thanks to our veterans, I am free.

Veterans used to get the attention they deserve. When a man returned home from fighting on the front lines, his family and friends would throw a welcoming celebration, he was thanked many times, and his face might even appear in the newspaper. Currently, the United States has Special Operations Forces in at least 134 countries around the world. Without them, the dark forces seeking to extinguish the flame of liberty will be successful.

Recently, in a school district not far from my home, students began protesting because their history textbooks were misrepresenting historical events. Veterans could stop that, because they made history-they were there, and witnessed it firsthand. If we take the time to listen to their stories and ask them about their lives, we can learn what really happened. We don't have to rely on hear-say to know the facts, when we have the authors of history among us. These heroes deserve to be heard, and we are foolish if we don't take advantage of the opportunity.

As a high school student, everything I do is motivated by the future. 'plan my future, I prepare for my future, and it is easy to take my future for granted. It's easy to assume ,'1/ have a future. It's easy to assume I'll have an America to live in when I'm older. Reality is, though, that freedom is not free-America is only as free she is

brave. Veterans are the backbone of America. Veterans provide the truth and inspiration necessary to maintain my generation's American Pride.

He joined the VFW in 1996 at Post 10047 in Las Vegas, Nev. He maintains his Gold Legacy Life Membership at Post 2313 in Hawthorne, Nev. Mr. Stroud has served the VFW in many leadership

Happy New Year! Wishing you and your families a Happy and Healthy 2015! Last year flew by too fast. My

father use to tell me that the older you get, the faster time goes by. Now that I am getting older, I hate to admit that he was right.

On Thursday, November 6, 2014, I attended the 24th Annual Homeless Veterans Stand Down in Denver. This is my fourth year to attend and I always get my flu shot from the VA nurses. Many services are available to the homeless veterans. Employment services, legal services and medical services are offered. Veterans Administration representatives are available to handle disability claims and help with housing referrals. Breakfast and lunch was provided. Haircuts and glasses adjustment are available free of charge. As they exit the building, the homeless veterans are given care kits and warm clothing. Pueblo, Colorado Springs, Ft. Collins and Grand Junction are other locations in the state where Homeless Veterans Stand Down occur. I encourage you to attend a Stand Down near you this coming fall. Do you know that without the Veterans of Foreign Wars, there would not be no Veterans Administration? There would be no compensation, no benefits, no one to ensure our veterans and military families are cared for after serving our country. VFW service officers, who are familiar with the VA bureaucracy and paperwork, can submit forms on behalf of veterans, help file appeals if disability benefits are denied, or simply offer advice to those who want to file their own disability claims regardless of whether the veteran belongs to the Veterans of Foreign Wars.

Over the past two years, more than 200,000 veterans have taken advantage of the help and have collectively obtained almost \$6 billion in benefits from the VA.

John Quincy Adams made the following quote, "If your actions inspire others to dream more, learn more, do more and become more, you are a leader." This quote can and should apply to everyone in the VFW.

I look forward to visiting with you at the Council of Administration meeting March 28 & 29 in Golden Post #4171. Let's all work together to support and honor veterans!

Since our last newsletter, I have had the honor to represent the Department of Colorado VFW at several community events and functions. The most

interesting include Kiewit-Turner and the Department of Veterans Affairs at the construction site of the new VA Replacement Hospital on several occasions. I was feeling quite comfortable the new facility was moving forward in due process and we would expect a completion date in early May 2016. What a surprise when on December 9, 2014 in my email box came the decision from the United States Civilian Board of Contract Appeals that Judge Candida Steel handed down the decision that KT had won it's case against the VA regarding this important case and KT could cease building effective immediately. On December 16th I attended a meeting with Secretary VA Sloan Gibson and other VSO from Colorado. The Secretary stated he was having a meeting with KT the next day and would do everything in his power to get them back on the job ASAP. The VA would pay KT \$157 million for past costs. The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers would take an advisory and assessment role and assume responsibility from the VA of the project. ŴOW – finally back to work for our much needed and long awaited new replacement hospital. Secretary Gibson stated completion is now early 2017. The PTSD and CLC has a chance of being build concurrently instead of the prior schedule which would have had each being build 12 months apart.

Your Department Commander asked me to attend a meeting with a Polish Delegation representing the Polish Army and Wounded Warriors Assistance program through the U.S. Department of State. We met at the VA Hospital Directors conference room on December 15th. We learned about the care received by their combat troops. We were told Poland has the second largest number of troops in Iraq of all allies. They also are engaged in Afghanistan and Kosovo. Troops with PTSD are sent to Warsaw where they receive ideal clinical research environment. The average age of combat troops is 30 years old. 62 have been killed in Iraq and some 800 wounded. The reason for their call here in Denver was to learn how our medical VA system works and how we care for our combat wounded. The country has some 58,000 "profes-

sional soldiers" nationwide.

Looking to 2015, we look to focusing on veterans, their families and needs. Please look and see what you are doing in your communities to serve our comrades. Not only do we need to care for each other in our Posts, we need to fulfill our commitment to help our comrades who may be in need. Please, let us not forget.

It is now January. That is 90 days from the end of September. From the

end of September to the end of October is 30 days. That is the amount of time Quartermasters have to turn in the Quarterly Audit for the Quarter ending September 30th. We have 17 Posts and 1 District that have not turned in their audits for September. We also have 1 Post that has not turned in an audit at all. I will reference MOP sections for your reading pleasure to show you who is responsible for turning in audits. If there are any questions, please feel free to contact Department Headquarters for clarification. Section 218 (a) (1) (i&j). Section 218 (a) (5) (e). Section 218 (a) (11) (b).

We have just completed 2 years of calendar raffles. The purpose of these raffles

was to raise funds to help maintain our Service Office. As many of you may, or may not know, National cut our service Office funding by \$20,000 per year. We decided to try and make up the shortfall by having State wide fund raisers. The first shot was selling calendars and have a weekly drawing for cash. This was not very successful. We made an average of approximately \$7500 per year. Not good enough. We are no longer holding calendar raffles. We are having gun raffles. We had the first drawing for a Henry rifle in December and was more successful. We are currently raffling a Ruger SR1911 9mm pistol. Information in in this veteran.

I want to thank all the Posts and officers who've made an effort to help your Post do what we do------HELP VETERANS. Keep up the good work, and remember, No One Does More for Veterans.

GENERAL ORDERS NO. 3 2014-2015 **February 1, 2015** Please remind all Posts that you MUST be 100% +1 to qualify for All State. Deadline is April 30, 2015. Entry forms will be mailed to all that qualify.

- 1. As prescribed by Sec 217 & Sec 221 of the National By-Laws and Manual of Procedure, Posts having two (2) meetings a month will hold nominations at the first meeting in April with elections at the next regular in April. While Posts with only (1) one meeting a month will hold nominations in March and elections in April and that all members must be notified of such
- (a) The officers of each Post will consist of a Commander, Senior Vice Commander, Junior Vice Commander, Quartermaster, Adjutant, Chaplain, Judge Advocate, Surgeon and three (3) Trustees.
- (b) The Post shall elect the Commander, Senior Vice Commander, Junior Vice Commander, Quartermaster, Chaplain and three trustees.
- (c) The Appointed officers of each Post shall consist of at least an Adjutant, Judge Advocate, Surgeon, Officer of the Day, Service Officer and Guard to be appointed as prescribed in Section 216 in the Manual of Procedure
- 2. Proof of Eligibility Requirements for Officers: All Posts, Districts and Department should be reminded of the provisions of Sec. 216(c), 316, 414(c), and 515(d) of the National By-Laws and Manual or procedure that officers, elected and appointed, shall not be installed or assume the duties of their office until such proof of eligibility has been submitted to the respective Adjutant for review
- 3. Registration for the VFW National Convention: Each Post will pay, in advance, a national registration fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25) which shall entitle the Post to a packet of convention information and materials and one identified registered delegate for the National Convention. Each additional delegate attending the national convention will pay a ten dollar (\$10) delegate fee, in accordance with the requirements of Sec 222 of the National Constitution and By-Laws. **Delegate fees should be sent** directly to the Quartermaster General at National Headquarters.
- **4. Attention is directed** to Sec. 213 of the National By-Laws concerning arrearages of Posts for National, Department, or District Dues, National Convention registration, poppy money, supply money or other financial obligations, or failure to have the office of Quartermaster properly bonded in accordance with Section 703 of the National By-Laws, or failure to submit properly completed quarterly Post Trustees Report of Audit or Post Election Reports. Posts that are delinquent in any of the aforementioned shall be deprived of all representation in County Council meetings, District, Department and National Conventions.

- 5. Attention of Post Commanders is directed to Sec. 218, Manual of Procedure, Duty of Trustees. Trustees Report of Audit must be completed by the Trustees, in detail, at the close of each quarter, one of which ends March 31st. Commanders are reminded that all funds are to be under the custody and control of the Post Quartermaster. Persons other than the Post Quartermaster who may handle Post funds, such as club manager, bingo chairman, or committee chairmen are responsible to the Post Quartermaster to maintain accurate records and accounts and should be properly bonded. Post Trustees are to ensure that the financial records of these special funds are also audited in the same manner as the other accounts of the Post Quartermaster.
- 6. Commanders on all levels should begin organizing their 2015 Memorial Day Buddy Poppy Campaign. To qualify for Post All American, VFW Posts must order a minimum of five (5) Buddy Poppies per member for the program year from Department Headquarters.
- 7. All-State Commanders and Quartermasters. Entry forms for All-State Commanders and Quartermasters will be mailed to all qualified persons. Posts and Districts must be 100% + 1 in membership by April 30, 2015, in order for the Commanders and/or Quartermasters to be eligible for this award. The Commander's Department Leadership Manual, along with the entry form, must arrive at Department Headquarters not later than close of business on Wednesday May 13, 2015, to be judged. Post Quartermasters need only submit the entry form by the same deadline date.
- 8. Council of Administration meeting will be March 29, 2015 at VFW Post No. 4171, 15625 W 10th. Ave., Golden, 8:30 am for Joint Meeting. Workshops will begin March 28 at the Post home 10:00 am.
- 9. State Convention is scheduled for Sheridan, Colorado, June 17 through June 21, 2015. See Page 8 of the Colorado Veteran for pre-registration, golf, hotels and Convention Book ads.

Commander and Chief Brian J. Duffy who came in early for the November Council of Administration so he could tour our VA Medical Facilities. That Thursday we met at the Eastern Colorado Health Care System (new Denver VA Hospital) and was briefed on where the building process was, were the medical divisions will be located, where the patients will park and proceed to their appointments and a lot more. I really suggest that you sit down at a computer and go to the website www,denver.va.gov and learn more about your VA Hospital. Those that don't have a computer, you can go to the library and I am told the librarian would help you.

Thursday afternoon we went to the VA Clinic in Golden. We toured the facility and it is an up to date facility and provides Personal Care: Highly qualified primary care providers, Laboratory & Radiology services, Physical Therapy, Nutritional Medicine, Audiology, and Travel Vouchers. It is a very nice facility that can handle most of our needs. We also learned a little about TeleMed it's like remote patient monitoring - to enable location-independent care. Its multichannel health services center enables elderly patients to access care through several virtual health channels. Golden is one of these centers.

Friday morning we toured the Colorado Springs VA Clinic, what a stunning facility, it has a lobby that is very large and homely at the same time. Services at the Colorado Springs Clinic are: Optometry, Audiology, Pharmacy, Occupational Therapy, Physical Therapy, Laboratory, Compensation and Pension, CWT, Homeless, and the Pre and Post-Surgical Clinic are located on the first floor. Primary Care services, OEF/OIF, wound care, and MOVE classroom are located on the second floor. Dental, Mental Health, and Substance Abuse Clinics are located on the third floor. New Services: MRI, CT, ultrasound, and x-ray services as well as the Veterans Benefits Administration (VBA) are located on the first floor

This clinic is larger then the others due to the Military bases in the area. As it was explained to me, when the men and women get out or retire from the service a lot of them stay in the area.

Friday afternoon we visited the Pueblo Clinic, it too is a fine clinic, which serves

the Southern Colorado area. Features include Primary care services, Laboratory & Radiology services, Physical Therapy, Nutritional Medicine, Audiology and Dental. Specialty care are referred to the Colorado Springs CBOC and Denver VA Medical Center.

The thing I came away with from this tour is that the facilities that we have in our state that serve our Veterans medical needs are some of the Top in the Nation.

District 11's Commander Dick Ball invited the Director of the Western Colorado Health Care System Mr. Marc A. Magill to speak at the District meeting in Rifle. I went to Rifle a day earlier to visit the Veterans Community Living Center at Rifle. When I arrived I found the Ladies Auxiliary was there for the same propose, so I joined them in their tour.

The center is set on Colorado's Western Slope in a quiet residential neighborhood with beautiful views of the Rocky Mountains. It is a 89-bed nursing home, with a 12-bed secure memory care unit, and offer the following services: Long-term care: Residents receive medical and non-medical care, including skilled nursing services; physical, occupational and speech therapy; social activities; and assistance with other activities of daily living. Memory care: for individuals with Alzheimer's disease and other forms of dementia. Short-term rehabilitation: Physical, occupational and speech therapies. Shortterm "respite" care: Short-term stays are available when home-care providers or family members are unavailable. End-oflife services: Comfort-oriented care and family support are available to individuals during this time.

While I was at the Rifle Center I met a couple of people that stuck my fancy, the first was a young lady who was in her wheel chair but was joking and visiting with us and wondering why we were there. I said young that's right 100 years young. What A Lady. The second was a Cowboy from the boots to the straw cowboy hat. We talk for quite awhile, about ranching and his life on his ranch. A very interesting individual.

At the District meeting I presented Mr. Magill and Rifle Living Center with checks for the purpose of the residents

I would like to thank Comrade Janine Barth for setting up the tour, for it was a fantastic day and I can't wait to go visit my new found friends again. Thanks Janine.

Scholarships

Happy New Year to all! I wish you all blessings that you will have all that you need and be grateful for what you have and not so quick to want what you do not need! May abundance, love and happiness surround you throughout the year! I start this New Year with a new positive perspective and excitement for what lies ahead for the Ladies Auxiliary to the Veterans of Foreign Wars! I love each and every one of you because you have brought me friendship, taught me lessons of humility and of course the never ending love and support that only family can! Welcome 2015!

I believe we are an exceptional, Godblessed country and we must stand up for that or this nation will fall. The Ladies Auxiliary to the Veterans of Foreign Wars must reinforce the pride we have in our veterans, their families and our country. So with this being said I feel there are two gifts that our organization can give to our next generation of young people. Two competitions have been completed, as this issue of the Colorado Veteran went to print. Our first place winners for the Voice of Democracy and Patriots Pen have already been forwarded to National for judging. Two scholarship programs down and three more to go!

The Continuing Education Scholarship's deadline is February 15 so there's no time to waste. Remember this contest is eligible to any Ladies Auxiliary member who has been a member for at least one year, her spouse, son or daughter (18 or older) who are pursuing post

high school education (college, post grad, master or doctorate) and are in financial need. Each candidate must complete the contest application and a 300 words or less essay. These items then need to be sent to our national headquarters to the attention of the Director of Programs by February 15. There will be one \$1,000 scholarship awarded to one contestant in each conference. Since the applications are going directly to headquarters, please make sure the auxiliary chairman report their number of entries to you.

If your Auxiliary is lucky enough to have a Junior Girls Unit then make sure they are aware of our Junior Girls Scholarship. A Junior Girl age 13 to 16 who has been a member for at least one year is eligible. The completed application and required information must be into the local Auxiliary by the deadline of March 11. One national winner will receive a \$7,500 scholarship to be held in escrow until she attends college!

Next is our Young American Creative Patriotic Art Contest. High school students in grades 9 to 12 in public, private, technical schools and home-schools are eligible. Entry deadline for artwork (with a patriotic theme) and application into local Auxiliary is March 31. There are eight national awards with the highest being \$10,000! Remember to make contest brochures available to different types of youth groups as well as community art studios, art galleries, and on websites, Facebook, etc. For all our competitions please remind members that it is very important to see that rules and deadlines are adhered. It would be a shame to have someone disqualified after they have put so much effort into their entry.

Now through the Branding Center, Auxiliaries, Districts and Departments can find different versions of the emblem for use with any Auxiliary-related event or communication. The emblem is now pre-authorized for uses like: •Newsletters •Fliers •Websites • Facebook • Twitter

The pre-authorization is for Auxiliary-related events or communications only and is NOT granted for individual member use. For instance, if an Auxiliary has its own website or Facebook account, they may use the provided versions. An individual member may not use them for her personal accounts. Authorization is still required for any emblem or tagline uses that involve a third party. For

example, if an Auxiliary is doing an event or project with a local business and that business wants to put the emblem on a sign, the Auxiliary must get approval. To do that, find the authorization form behind login, fill it out and send it to the VFW Quartermaster General's office at qmgeneral@vfw.org. A recent change to VFW Bylaws calls for this new procedure.

Please use ONLY the pre-authorized versions and discard all other versions. There are many unauthorized versions available on the Internet that are not consistent with the organization's branding standards. The emblem above is the official trademarked image.
