<u>American Flag</u> – White Stars on a field of blue represent the States of our Nation. Stripes for the courage and sacrifice of our Nation's defenders. The white stripes signify our desire for liberty and land of the free. The blue signifies justice for all, as well as vigilance and perseverance.

POW-MIA Flag – Black and white stands as a stark reminder of Americans who are still prisoners, missing or otherwise unaccounted for. The words "You Are Not Forgotten" state that we will not forget them or their sacrifices in protecting us and our freedoms. We will continue our efforts to find those still missing until all are accounted for.

<u>Buddy Poppy</u> – We recognize those that gave their all as stated in the poem "Flanders Field". It is important to remember them with respect and honor.

<u>Yellow Ribbon</u> – We show our hope for the safe return of our deployed active military and also hope for the return of those still missing and their accountability. It also represents moving on from the past and looking to the future. Teal/Purple outlines are from the suicide prevention ribbon signifying hope and courage for those who have attempted suicide and remembrance for those who lost their battle.

Program Reporting

Beginning with the 2023-2024 program reporting year, all program reporting for the National Programs will need to be completed on the Department of Colorado website at vfwco.org. Reporting here has been made quite simple and any member can report on the activities they have been involved in. This process can be used by both VFW and Auxiliary members.

After logging into the website, you will need to click on **Auxiliary** and then **Reporting.** You will see a brief description of the activities that you can report on for each National program. As you scroll down the page, you will find a picture and underlined name of each program. Click on the picture and just fill in the blanks. Wherever you see an arrowhead, you can click there to see a list of options provided for you. For instance when asked "Who Participated" click the arrowhead and choose VFW, Auxiliary or Both depending on who you are reporting for.

When you have filled in all the relevant boxes simply click "Submit." Please do not try to mail paper copies to the VFW Department office. They will not be accepted.

All the program reporting received through the website will be available to be viewed by the Department Program Chairmen for annual judging.

Supplemental Reporting

Department Program Chairmen are required to report some information annually to the National Ambassadors that is not included in our shared reporting system. Therefore, we have designed one additional form containing all the extra information that the Auxiliaries need to report. This can be done as often as you wish but should be completed at least annually by every auxiliary. Completed forms can be mailed or emailed to the Department Secretary, Cindy Anderson at 8281 Clay St Unit A, Westminster, CO 80031 or <u>andersoncindy1109@gmail.com</u> for distribution to the Chairmen. The deadline for this supplemental form is the same as our program year which ends March 31, 2024.

Our society, military, and government use just letters and often those abbreviations minimize what is behind them. #pow/mia/kia is used often. Many of our community have no idea what that says. Coming up in September is POW/MIA Remembrance Day. These individuals deserve honor and recognition. Host a special program, have a dedication ceremony, write about them in your newsletter, share their stories, meet their families, acknowledge them. Ask our governor to issue a proclamation acknowledging the 3rd Friday in September as POW/MIA Remembrance Day. Then continue thru the next months being that awesome example of what Americanism really means.

Encourage and enhance the duty of your Patriotic Instructors with presenting schools of instructions, verbiage definitions, meaning of gavel taps, addressing the membership at a meeting.

#morethanletters: PTS stands for Post Traumatic Stress. Consider these letters being – Post Tribal Separation. Our country is immersed in the extremes of life: climate change, inflated costs of food, rent, fuel. When our veterans come home, they experience extremes too: being out of uniform, without comrades, lack of specific mission. This is VFW Auxiliary Americanism charge for 2023-2024. We become their #AuxTribe. Think about it. Our auxiliary traditions, uniforms, mission to serve veterans and their families are very similar to what they have left. Honor and present the traditions they are yearning for.

AUXILIARY OUTREACH

Greetings all my Auxiliary friends!

First of all, I would like to thank President Phil Reinpold for having faith in me by allowing me the opportunity to serve as your Auxiliary Outreach Chairman this year. This program has always been around, National has just changed the name and added a few requirements to the program in the past couple years. Our organization has always been active in our communities, we just need to remember to report it differently.

The VFW Auxiliary Outreach Program involves your Auxiliary volunteering to help other nonprofit organizations, local groups and others with needs in your community. Auxiliary Outreach is time given to help, not monetary or in-kind donations. It is a partnership wherein one or more of your Auxiliary members help another organization or group make their project successful. Like us, many organizations are short on volunteers, so if we all join forces and work together, just imagine what great things we can accomplish!

Ask what your Auxiliary can do to help the community, not what they can do to help us! Form a partnership to help other organizations by reaching out into your communities, local groups and organizations and offer to assist, then present the opportunity to your Auxiliary for a vote and then report it.

Where does your Auxiliary find these partnership opportunities?

- Ask your Auxiliary members: Most members belong to more than one organization.
- Look in your local new newspaper for upcoming events.
- Check local community bulletin boards.
- Check your local and surrounding town/city websites for their calendar of events.

Suggestions for VFW Auxiliary Outreach

- Work with local police, fire and EMT on their activities (Child ID, fire safety and fire prevention activities at the local schools.)
- Work with local parks and recreation departments to plant trees, clear trails and beautify parks.
- Serve food at soup kitchens or distribute food at food banks/cupboards.
- Drive for Meals on Wheels to help prepare food for delivery.
- Assist with local fundraising walks as a volunteer, not an entrant.
- Help your local library by working at book fairs.
- Assist local youth activities and at senior centers.
- Help during your local town or city during elections but remain non-partisan.
- Partnerships can be a single day event or ongoing events throughout the year.

Benefits of the Auxiliary Outreach Program

- Helping others
- Learn new skills
- Meeting new people & possibly getting new Auxiliary members
- Developing a sense of purpose
- Personal growth

Keys to making your Auxiliary Outreach Program successful

- Find organizations that need your help
- Vote on the activity at your meetings

- On rare occasions such as a natural disaster or an emergency community need, the project may be voted on after the fact
- Activity can be a onetime event or an ongoing event
- One or more Auxiliary member(s) must participate
- Projects may be done by the Auxiliary alone or with the VFW Post
- Wear your VFW Auxiliary attire (name badge, shirt, hat, jacket, etc.)
- Report, report, report your hours volunteered

What does NOT count toward Auxiliary Outreach

- Auxiliary Outreach is for projects NOT AFFILIATED with VFW or VFW Auxiliary programs.
- Volunteer work that is performed for the benefit of the VFW Post or Auxiliary is NOT considered outreach service. Examples of projects that do not qualify include:
 - 1. Repairs or maintenance to the Post Home
 - 2. Cooking or serving a meal for a Post or Auxiliary fundraiser
 - 3. "Buddy Poppy" distribution
 - 4. VFW or Auxiliary meetings, Conventions, Conferences or Schools of Instruction
 - 5. Church activities for one specific congregation and not the entire community (e.g., usher, elder, deacon, minister, etc.)
 - 6. Taking comfort items to the local USO
 - 7. Donating trophies to a youth sports group
 - 8. Hosting a luncheon/dinner for a local community club
 - 9. Sending an Auxiliary check to support a charity that organized a walk, run, or donation request
 - 10. Collecting clothing and comfort items for homeless Veterans at the Post Home

There are more resources available that outline Auxiliary Outreach on the website behind your MALTA login, Member Resources, Auxiliary Outreach.

BUDDY POPPY

I want to thank Department President Phil Reinpold for asking me to be program chairman for the Buddy Poppy-National Home for the 2023-2024 year. This, like all the programs that the VFW Auxiliary does throughout the year, supports our veterans in many ways.

That little red flower, the one known as the Buddy Poppy, is a very powerful flower. It got its beginning in 1922, and in 1923 it was assembled by disabled and needy veterans who would be paid for their work to provide them with financial assistance. In 1924, we registered the name Buddy Poppy with the U.S. Patent Office, and on May 20, 1924, we were granted all trademark rights in the name Buddy under the classification of artificial flowers.

The VFW Buddy Program provides a compensation to the veterans who assemble the poppies, and provides assistance to many other programs as follows:

- 1.5 cents go to Department Veterans Service Funds
- 1 cent goes to National Home For Children
- 1 cent goes to VFW National Headquarters Service Fund

The money we raise also goes to the Auxiliary Relief Fund. This fund is for helping our members who are in need of financial assistance, sending monetary gifts to National Auxiliary Cancer Aid and Research, and to foster true patriotism through historical and educational programs.

NATIONAL HOME FOR CHILDREN

The National Home has been a place for veterans and their families to recover from hardships. The National Home has services that help with reintegration, PTSD, unemployment, etc. This is a four-year program where there is free daycare for families, so they can work, or go to school, so that they can become self-sufficient and return to today's society. The National Home relies strictly on donations with no other funding. So, besides our Buddy Poppy money, there are other ways that we can help support the National Home.

- By a membership which is only \$50.00
- Buy a memory brick which is \$100.00
- Purchase products through Amazon smiles-choose them as you charity-0.5% of purchases goes to the Home.
- Do a monthly donation, whatever you're comfortable with

The five essentials of an Auxiliary are: a) 10 meetings a year; b) dues paid by 10 members before February of current year; c) Quarterly Audits of Trustees submitted to the Treasurer; d) Officers elected, installed, and reported to National by June 30; and e) President and Treasurer must be bonded by August 31.

If yellow or red flags do begin to arise, the Chief of Staff can provide guidance to help mitigate issues and provide resolutions that may be needed in a timely manner. The above resources can help to maintain and keep an Auxiliary healthy and in good working order.

As Auxiliary members, it is important to be respectful, share our knowledge and encourage each other. Through mentoring, educating, and training we can strengthen our Auxiliaries to have new, qualified, and experienced leaders. Leadership is a key to growth that can ultimately strengthen and lead to success for our Auxiliaries.



This help for our Veterans is 100% FREE and confidential.

Here, at Operation Veteran Strong, Veterans get the tools they need to get things done. With their free, confidential account, they can connect on their own terms with: Veteran benefits, VSO contacts, outdoor recreation, employment, financial support, education, family, and spouse supports, vet groups, VFW's, community support, and so much more. And most importantly both medical and non-medicalized solutions for Veterans returning to civilian life. They also specialize in mental health programs and help with Suicide Awareness. We, as a nation, are losing our Veterans by Suicide at an average of 22 a day. This includes Veterans that are just returning home and can't cope with returning to civilian life and our World War II, Korean and Vietnam Veterans. This organization has free help for them. For anyone who has experienced the suicide of a friend or family member, it is traumatic. This great organization also has help and resources for family members who are seeking resources to combat the many questions suicide leaves behind.

My main focus is ensuring every Post and Auxiliary member purchases a special project pin. The proceeds from these pins go towards Phil's special project. The money that is raised this year will go to help our military and veterans in their time of need. You can purchase these beautiful purple and teal ribbon pins, with the Auxiliary emblem in the middle. The pin's colors are from the suicide prevention ribbon. They signify hope and courage for those who have attempted suicide and remembrance for those who lost their battle. They truly represent Phil's special project that is dear and true to him – Suicide Awareness by proving "WE VALUE EVERY VETERAN."

You can order these beautiful pins by mailing an order (located in the Veteran) along with the monies to pay for the requested number of pins. Once I receive the order form, I will send your requested number of pins to you via USPS. The cost per pin is \$3 and you are allowed to resell the pins for \$3. If you resell the pins at a higher cost, you are required to send the extra monies into the Department of Colorado VFW Auxiliary. All monies raised from this pin are to go to Operation Veteran Strong.

Treasurers

When I have your audit and it is in balance and has been approved by the Auxiliary I will post it to the District Report which can be found on the Department website. This is updated weekly.

Youth Activities

Greetings everyone! My name is Kristi Wood, and I am honored that President Phil has asked me to serve as your Youth Activities Chair for 2023-2024. I am looking forward to working with all of you in support of our youth.

How do we define patriotism for youth? It is the love for or devotion to one's country. When was the first time you remember being introduced to patriotism and its meaning? Was it reciting the pledge of allegiance in school? Your parents flying a flag at home? Or was it listening to your parents or grandparents' stories about serving in the military?

Our youth today are our leaders of tomorrow. Focusing attention on our youth beginning at a young age is vital for them to appreciate our history and our veterans' sacrifices. We can start this focus by reaching out to them as young as 5 years old. Education is the key to helping our youth become who they will be tomorrow.

To support this, we can promote:

- Patriotism through Literacy
- Supporting and working with youth groups
- Get excited for the Red, White, and Blue
- Illustrating America

Patriotism through Literacy:

One of the easiest ways to promote patriotism is through reading with our youth. It is simple, fun, and free (if using a library). We need to educate our youth at an early age about who our historical figures were that helped to build this great country, the United States of America. Teaching patriotism through literature is just one step toward understanding and learning about patriotism.

Examples of books for youth:

- America the Beautiful by Cholena Rose Dare (ages 3-6)
- The Night before the 4th of July by Natasha Wing (ages 3-5)
- Fourth of July (Holiday in Rhythm and Rhyme) by Emma Carlson Berne (ages 5-7)
- Fireworks, Picnics, and Flags by James Cross Giblin (ages 10-12)
- What Does it Mean to be an American? By Rana DiOrio (ages 4-8)
- Our White House: Looking In, Looking Out created by the National Children's Book and Literacy Alliance with 110 renowned authors and illustrators
- A Patriots Handbook, Songs, Poems, Stories, and Speeches Celebrating the Land We Love, illustrated and introduced by Caroline Kennedy

Participation:

- Volunteer to read historical fiction to youth at your local library.
- Donate historical fiction books to your local elementary and/or middle school libraries, community libraries, or shelters.
- Host a read-a-thon and award prizes for the number of books read. Prizes could be a book for them to take home or stickers or pins.

Supporting and Working with Youth Groups:

Activities that assist and work with veterans and their families provide a vital source of community involvement for youth groups. The Girl Scouts, the Boy Scouts, church youth groups, Boys and Girls Clubs of America and school sponsored clubs are just a few groups that can benefit from our involvement.

Show these youth that we care. Invite a group to participate in some of our Auxiliary activities:

- Deliver groceries to a disabled veteran
- Help a veteran with yard work
- Take trash out for curbside pickup
- Visit nursing homes or hospitals
- Participate in card writing campaigns for VA hospitals, nursing homes, active military

Get Excited for the Red, White, and Blue:

It is so inspiring to listen to our youth sing our national anthem. This singing contest is divided into two grade divisions, K-8 and 9-12. Encourage youth to participate in this contest. Entries will be judged on vocal ability, mastery of lyrics, originality or interpretation and entertainment value.

Entry forms are located in MALTA Member Resources, Youth Activities and contains eligibility requirements, contest rules and deadlines.

Illustrating America:

Another way to encourage patriotism in youth is to participate in Illustrating America. The contest is open to any student grades K-8 who is enrolled in public, private, or parochial school, or a home study program in the United States, its territories, and possessions; or who are dependents of U.S. military or civilian personnel in overseas schools. There are 3 grade divisions, K-2, 3-5, and 6-8. For more details on requirements, contest rules and the student brochure and entry form, consult MALTA Member Resources, Youth Activities.

R.A.P Cards:

Our youth love awards for a job well done and what better way to reward them than handing out R.A.P Cards. You can explain what the R.A.P acronym means, Random Acts of Patriotism.

Participation:

- Have you observed youth showing patriotism?
- Have you seen a child thanking a veteran?
- Have you witnessed a child or youth place their hand over their heart correctly?
- Have you seen a child or youth show respect to our American flag?

If so, give them a R.A.P card. Go to Malta Member Resources, Youth Activities, to locate a template to print out. Try this fun and unique way to engage youth and encourage their patriotism.

Two department only programs I would like to encourage auxiliaries to participate in are the Outstanding Youth Group of the Year and Outstanding Young Volunteer of the Year. The Department Young Volunteer of the Year winner will receive \$200, and the Department Youth Group of the Year will receive \$300 at the state convention in 2024. I've included the program

information and form so please keep these programs in mind as you are planning your youth activities for this upcoming year.

As always, report all activities, early and often, related to youth activities.
