Gregory A. Stafford was appointed National Inspector General of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the U.S. on August 1, 2024, at the 125th VFW National Convention in Louisville, Kentucky.

Greg served in the United States Navy from 1983 to 2005, earning his VFW eligibility by serving during Operation Enduring Freedom. In recognition of his service, he received four Navy/Marine Corps Commendation Medals, two Navy Achievement Medals, six Good Conduct Medals, two National Defense Service Medals, and the Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal, among others.

He joined the VFW in 2008 at Post 6060 in Elizabeth City, North Carolina, where he maintains his Gold Legacy Life membership. He has served in elected and appointed positions at the Post, District and Department levels, culminating with his election as the VFW Department of North Carolina Commander in 2017. On the national level, Greg is serving his second term on the Council of Administration, previously serving from 2018 to 2022. He has also served on the National Budget & Finance Committee, the National Security and Foreign Affairs Committee and as National Aide-de-Camp.

Greg received his bachelor's degree in history and secondary education from Elizabeth State University in 2009. He is retired.

He is a life member of the VFW National Home, Disabled American Veterans and the Military Order of the Cootie.

I feel like some of you have gotten to know me recently, but not all of you have and I figured, instead of barking orders and telling you that you need to get your bonds and audits in at a normal time or tell you how you need to recruit everyone eligible into our ranks. I thought I'd share what got me to be in the VFW and the Passion I have for this organization.

I first joined the VFW in San Diego at VFW 7420 in 2006 shortly after I came home from deployment and never really thought of the VFW again. I didn't even pay my dues for years. Then on 9/30/2014, 10 years ago I lost one of my Best Navy friends to Suicide. RIP Sean Flaugher, this one hit hard. He was my roommate in A-school, we'd later work together in San Diego shortly before I got out. About 9 months later after Sean died I would be struggling with my own mental health and gratefully soon find my community and my purpose at VFW Post 1 and fall into a rabbit hole of growth from just a guy who showed Art with Art of War Project, in the Post. To help found the Veterans Arts Council, being the Head curator and assistant director, to later ascend and become a leader in the Post, first as Surgeon and then later Post Adjutant/ Quartermaster and currently Commander and continuing my journey into the VFW Department of Colorado chairs as the State Adjutant/ Quartermaster.

People ask me why as a young veteran at 40 years old; WHY do all I do for the VFW. Simply put it saved me, it helped bring me out of the dark, it gave me a sense of purpose that I lost. It gave me my veteran family back; it was where I needed to be. It's why I'm so passionate about growing this organization and trying to recruit every eligible veteran into it. I know those who we've had a positive impact on, I talk to them every day, I see them grow as I did. I wish more who chose the path of suicide found a place in a VFW first, they would have gotten through it, they might still be here. I'm glad I did.

I hope it continues well into the future after I'm gone. The VFW is important, and it's a pillar of the Veteran community since our Founder returned from war 125 years ago. That's why I expect greatness from everyone in the VFW, that's why I am #stillserving!

General Orders No. 2 October 15, 2024 Series: 2024-2025

- **1. Post & District Inspections should be completed by December 31, 2024**. Send (1) copy to Department Headquarters for the Department Inspector to review. If he finds any irregularities, he will confer with the State Commander and a letter of recommendation will be written to the Post Commander.
- **2. Section 709 of the VFW National By-Laws** concerns Disposition of Real Property, i.e. Post Homes. Written notice of such proposal has first to be given to each member of said unit at least ten (10) days prior to such regular or special meeting and at least 30 days to the Department Commander prior to the regular or special meeting, at which the proposal is to be considered. A two-thirds (2/3) vote of approval of those present and voting at such regular or special meeting.
- **3.** It is the obligation of every member to GET OUT AND VOTE for the candidates of their choice. Take a friend or friends with you to the voting place. Election Day is November 5th and you must be registered to exercise your right to vote.
- **4. Section 218 (a) (11), Duty of Trustees,** Trustees shall not be eligible to serve on committees or as officers whose books, records and accounts are audited by the Trustees. Post Commanders and Post Trustees are reminded that the 2nd Post Trustee Report of Audit is due to Department Headquarters by October 25, 2023 to meet All State requirements. Please see your Post Quartermaster for forms and records.
- **5. Please be informed that any Post or District requesting a Department Officer** to attend a VFW function should make such request in writing to the State Commander. Please allow sufficient time, at least three (3) weeks, for Department to make arrangements.
- **6. All VFW Posts are required to have the revised 2025-year By-Laws and Ritual books** from the VFW National Emblem and Supply Department. Please see your Post Quartermaster and ask them to order for you. All members should be informed that the Post Quartermaster has a current supply catalog, and they can assist you with your order. It can also be downloaded from the National VFW website at https://vfw.org/my-vfw-training-and-support/ bylaws-training-forms-and-templates for free.
- 7. An annual income tax return (Form 990) is required of each Post, or District exempt from tax under section 501 (c) 19 of the Federal Code. Starting in 2008 ALL VFW POSTS, and DISTRICTS with gross receipts of \$50,000 or less have to E-FILE, EVERY YEAR. All Posts exceeding \$50,000 in gross receipts must file on Form 990 or Form 990EZ. Forms and instructions are available from www. irs.gov. Gross receipts include income from all sources, including membership dues, bar or restaurant receipts, etc. Some of this may be unrelated business income, in which case filing of Form 990-T may be required. Exempt organizations that are under section 501(c) and have gross receipts greater than \$50,000 but less than \$200,000 and assets less than \$500,000, may file Form 990EZ instead of Form 990. If an organization eligible to submit the Form 990N or file the Form 990EZ chooses to file the Form 990, it must file a complete return. This return must be filed on or before the 15th day of the fifth month after the end of the accounting year (November 15 for June 30 year end or May 15 for calendar year end). Request for extension of time to file may be made by submitting form 8868, Application for Extension of Time to File. If a Post, or District fails to file the return on or before the due date, or the extended date, a penalty of \$20 for each day the return is late (not to exceed the smaller of \$10,000 or 5% of the gross receipts of the organization for the year) may be imposed, unless the organization can show that the late filing was due to reasonable cause. If you do not file for three (3) consecutive years your Post, or District will lose their non-profit standing with IRS and have to re-apply for non-profit standing and pay to file the application.
- **8. All Posts are reminded that they are responsible** for filing of State Compensation Insurance, State and Federal Unemployment, State and Federal Withholding Tax and any local employee/employer tax, if you have one or more employees.

With ongoing discussions about potential cuts to programs that directly impact veterans and their families, it's more important than ever to align ourselves with candidates who share the VFW's Priority Goals. These goals are not mere talking points; they embody the needs and rights of those who have served our nation. By electing representatives who prioritize veteran issues, we can help safeguard essential services and benefits.

Register to Vote

Voter registration and participation are crucial in amplifying our voices. According to surveys within the VFW community, an impressive 89.7% of us are registered to vote, and 99.3% of those registered voters actively participate in elections. When I visit new members of Congress, I remind them that there are nearly 700,000 veterans and family members in Colorado, and our collective voice matters.

Get Involved

Here's what we need from you: if you're not already registered, take the time to do so! As Congress returns home to campaign, download and print a copy of the latest VFWCO Legislative Priorities from VFWCO Linktree https://linktr.ee/vfwco. Attend townhalls of all candidates—wear your Auxiliary or VFW cap and sit in the front seats. Let them know you're a proud VFW member!

Speak Up

VFW Department of Colorado - Fund Assistance

The VFW Department of Colorado Foundation has gone through some changes again. We have new administrative staff and have gotten back into a deal with the Veteran's Trust Fund. All grant applications will come to VFW Department of Colorado Headquarters. The amount has not changed, we will still grant up to \$500 on a one-time basis for emergencies. The application and requirements will be on the VFW Department of Colorado website.

The Department of Colorado also has the Ralph W. Emerson/Jack Gulden Memorial Blood/Cancer Fund. The application may apply once every 12 months with a lifetime maximum of 2 times for a grant of \$500 to cover out of pocket expenses. The application must be a current member of the VFW or it's auxiliary and must include their member number, and auxiliary members must include a copy of their membership card. This fund covers acceptable receipted expenses for the following: treatments such a chemo, radiation, surgical and any other medical procedure concerning cancer treatments; blood work, including transfusions, platelet infusions, transplants, and any other procedure concerning blood; travel receipts will be accepted in the form of fuel receipts only. For more information please see the Department of Colorado Website.

The last fund that the VFW Department of Colorado offers is the Katy Rimpley Service Animal Assistance Fund. The applicant may apply once every 12 months for a grant of \$500 to help cover out of pocket expenses for pet insurance, veterinary appointments/treatments/inoculations, and pet food. The application must be a current member of the VFW or it's auxiliary and must include their member number, and auxiliary members must include a copy of their membership card. Receipts MUST accompany the grant application. Please see the Department of Colorado website for more information.

Our funds are fairly stable currently but all donations are greatly appreciated to continue to be able to serve our veterans and their families. All donations are tax deductible. If you have any questions please call Department Headquarters at 303-421-1630.

2024-2025 VFW Grants

The VFW Foundation has released the parameters for the 2024-25 grants that are available to Posts, Districts, and their Auxiliaries. As in years past they are reimbursement grants and are funded on a first come first served basis. Once funding for a particular grant is exhausted that grant will be closed until next year, so I suggest you jump on these opportunities right away.

In particular, I think every Post should consider supporting the annual <u>VFW Airlift</u> by utilizing the Uniting to Combat Hunger & Homelessness grant (now known as UTCH²).

To support the VFW Airlift, have your Post or Auxiliary send a donation, up to \$1500, to Department HQ as soon as possible. The Airlift organizers need time to purchase the non-perishable food that will be distributed throughout Colorado over the first weekend in December with the help of the Colorado Aviation Business Association (CABA). Once the airlift is completed a copy of the receipt will be provided to all who donated, to be included with the UTCH² grant application.

If you are interested in also addressing veteran homelessness in your communities, use the same grant. Instead of pounds of food, anti-homelessness efforts can be measured by the value of the in-kind donations (or cash donations) you provide. Think, supplying hygiene gear for a stand-down, or organization a coat drive for a local homeless shelter. Get creative and partner with a local group, like <u>Volunteers of America</u>, to document your Post's involvement.

Keep in mind, the UTCH² grant is limited to a total of \$1500 per Post **OR** Aux, not both. The minimum donation is \$500 for either entity, but multiple requests can be submitted during the grant cycle. So, talk with your counterparts do make sure you are maximizing your efforts while maintaining your eligibility for reimbursement.

On the other hand, the <u>#StillServing</u> grant can be utilized by a Post and the Post Auxiliary, as well as a District and the District's Auxiliary. The qualifications for this grant are more loosely defined but requires hands on participation in a community service project. You can't just cut a check on this one. Also, each grant applicant must submit their own project to receive their own reimbursement. But I always encourage Post members volunteer to support an Auxiliary project, and vice-versa, so each side of the house can be successful. The #StillServing grants are also between \$500 and \$1500 per project, but the project cannot be used to support required VFW programs (like VOD/PP or Buddy Poppies) or for building repairs.

Luckily, if your Post is in need of repairs, the Foundation brought back the Post Assistance Grant (PAG), where qualifying projects can be reimbursed up to \$2500 once every three years. What qualifies, you might ask? Well, either the purchase of materials or hiring of professionals to repair a defect or renovate a fixture on Post property, OR the purchase of equipment that enable a Post to better serve or sustain the service they provide to the community. Obviously, these purchases or repairs cannot be made to the canteen but are limited to the rest of the Post home.

All the above grants will be discussed in further detail during the 9 am training session on Saturday, October 19, during the COA weekend in Grand Junction. Refer to the Department website for the zoom link if you want to learn more but are not able to attend in person. For those who will be there, I look forward to seeing everyone and hearing your ideas on how to best utilize these funds. My class is also open to Auxiliary members, since they can participate in these grants, so the more the merrier.

Legislative

Our Legislative Program year is well underway and I am very pleased with members' participation on many levels! Auxiliary members are watching the news, the debates, the candidate's platform presentations and attending and participating in community forums. They are signing up to become poll workers, monitors and election judges. They are sending letters and calling their representatives regarding veteran issues. And very important, Auxiliary members are taking the time to report their activities – this is such a critical aspect of our efforts. It is my mission this year to keep you on the leading edge of issues and legislation that you need to know about. Here are some things that you can do to keep your members informed and active:

- If you have not already done so, please sign up for Action Corps Weekly and ask your Auxiliary teammates to do the same. Respond to VFW Action Alerts and make sure that your members do the same. When you sign up, you will automatically be subscribed to the Weekly Newsletter which will keep you updated on the issues and events that you need to know about. You don't have to be an Auxiliary member to sign up or participate encourage friends, teachers, community members, and others to sign up also they can help too! Within our state, our response rates to Action Alert recommendations ranges from a low of 1% of our total (VFW and Auxiliary members) to as much as 15%. Let's get our Alert response rate up in our state! There may be a Conference Challenge Program coming soon where we in Western Conference can show those in the other conferences how committed we are in Colorado to our veterans based on how we respond to and act on Action Alerts more information on this to follow.
- Continue to watch TV and listen to Radio News (as much as you can tolerate), attend town hall meetings, vote in local and national elections, attend school board and other community events. Keep sending letters to your legislators –Let your voice be heard! Keep track of your time, your mileage, and your contributions, if applicable. Report this information yourself or through your Auxiliary. If you discover something that is important with respect to our Veterans and families within your community, send me a note so that I can let everyone know.
- As noted previously, one of my key subjects last year, and an issue that I spoke about all over our state, was combatting "Claim Sharks." These legal firms prey on veterans and families by attempting to take large portions of benefits due them from settlements like PACT Act, Camp Lejune victims, extended Vietnam benefits, etc. Encourage anyone applying for benefits to **contact a VFW Veteran Service Officer first** before going to one of these law firms. There is Claim Shark Legislation <u>currently in the works</u> within Colorado I will continue to update you on this very important subject as more information becomes available.
- There have been positive developments with regard to House Resolution 9468. On September 20th, the Veterans Benefits Continuity and Accountability Supplemental Appropriations Act 2024 was signed into law. At risk before the passage of this bill, 7 million veterans stood to lose benefits on October 1, 2024 in areas such as:
 - *Pension Benefits
 - *GI Bill Benefits
 - *Burial Benefits
 - *Survivor Benefits

This legislation stepped in to fill in the VA's \$2.8 Billion shortfall and provides mechanisms to assure that such shortfalls do not happen in the future.

Of interest to our members now, SB 2888 / HR3933 the TAP Promotion Act (Transition Assistance Program) which
authorizes Veteran Service Organizations like the VFW to aid service members just leaving the service of our nation
in signing up for and receiving their well-deserved benefits.

I am looking forward to bringing you more action items and information throughout this year

Good afternoon Auxiliary Brothers and Sisters!

Even though the Auxiliary Outreach Program has been in effect for the past five (5) years, there still seems to be a lot of confusion on what is considered Auxiliary Outreach and what is NOT considered Auxiliary Outreach.

I know that our Auxiliaries are very busy in our communities, helping others. I also know that they do a lot for our Veterans. The main differences are –

When you help the Veterans, it is NOT considered Auxiliary Outreach! That falls under Veterans and Family Support.

When the Auxiliary has a booth at an event and the Auxiliary gets credit for the booth – that is NOT Auxiliary Outreach! That falls under Community Service.

But when the Auxiliary helps another organization in the community by working one of their booths, handing out water, manning the fishing pond, registering entries, etc.

Auxiliary Outreach is for project NOT AFFILIATED with the VFW or VFW Auxiliary programs. Again, there are a few rules: The event must be voted on by the Auxiliary membership AND the Auxiliary members must wear their Auxiliary name tag, shirt, hat, etc. that identifies them as Auxiliary members.

So we are going to play a game – and I have a few prizes for those who get the answers correct!!

I'll give a few examples and you will tell me if it is or is not Auxiliary Outreach.

1. John, who is an Auxiliary member, mowed his neighbor's lawn (the neighbor was a Veteran) out of the goodness of his heart. Is this Auxiliary Outreach?

No this is NOT Auxiliary Outreach. It would fall under Veterans and Family Support.

2. Susan, an Auxiliary member, went to donate blood. She noticed how busy the Red Cross volunteers were. She offered to stay and help, and they accepted. Is this Auxiliary Outreach?

This is NOT Auxiliary Outreach. However, while she was there, she asked if they could use

help in the future. They said yes. She brought it up at the next Auxiliary meeting, the Auxiliary voted yes to help with future Blood Drives. Now when there are blood drives, Sue and other members of the Auxiliary are there, wearing their Auxiliary attire and helping. This IS Auxiliary Outreach.

3. Paul, an Auxiliary member, visited the local Senior Center and found out that the center helps mow lawns and gather wood for other community members. He brought this up at his local meeting. The Auxiliary voted to partner with the Senior Center. Is this Auxilia-

ry Outreach?

Yes! It is helping another organization not affiliated with the VFW or Auxiliary.

4. Linda, an Auxiliary member, took her cat to the local spay and neuter animal clinic. They were overrun and needed help. At the next meeting, she brought this up at the local meeting. The Auxiliary voted to partner with the animal clinic. Is this Auxiliary Outreach?

Yes!

Hopefully, these examples will answer some of our questions. Continue to send me the reports and IF they are not Auxiliary Outreach, I will send them on to the appropriate chairman. Also, please give more information in the notes. Tell us WHAT you are doing; not just working a Fun Run – tell us that you handed out water, registered entries, flagged traffic, etc.

The monies raised through sales of the Veteran pin will be going to their joint Special Project, the "Equine-imity" Program of the White Ribbon Project. My goal is that each Auxiliary buy at least 10 of the Veteran pins.

The "Equine-imity" Program is a project in which those who receive services for any of the above referenced and in need of help, would be able to participate in a program that isn't the standard approach of therapy. Individuals who participate in the "Equine-imity" Program would participate in sessions that would span over approximately six weeks, assisting them to heal through connecting with the animals at Horse Partners. Currently, the project is geared more towards Veterans and Veteran caregivers, but the Intimate Partner Violence Assistant Program (IPVAP) has already been looking at creating a model of this for the survivors of Intimate Partner Violence (IPV), Domestic Violence and Sexual Abuse. The Rocky Mountain Regional VA would be the second VA facility to incorporate the program. San Diego VA was the first to implement this program for IPTV survivors.

Please remember our Veterans that are homebound, in hospitals or in our VA community living centers, phone call or a card during the holiday season goes a long way in lifting their spirits. GENERAL ORDER #2 November 1, 2024

All General Orders from the Department President are official and need to be read at the first meeting following receipt before being filed for reference.

- 1. **Presidents on all levels** are reminded that their duties in accordance with Section 810 of the National Bylaws are to preside and maintain order and enforce a strict observance of the Bylaws and ritual of the organization, appoint all officers and committees not otherwise provided for, see that there is no disruption during the meeting and if so, has the right to have the member causing the disruption removed.
- 2. **Members** should address all remarks to the President, not to other members in attendance. Members should stand and be recognized by the President and, if two stand at the same time, the President will decide who is recognized first.
- 3. No member will disrespect or embarrass any member of this organization at any time.
- **4. Department President Nadia Flores's Special Project** is The White Ribbon Project supporting the Equine-imity Program. Proceeds from the sale of the Veteran Pin and donations will go to support this fund.
- 5. Suggested donations to Health & Happiness should be processed through MALTA or mailed directly to National Auxiliary Head-quarters in Kansas City earmarked for Health and Happiness. Department Hospital donations should be mailed to Department Treasurer Cindy Anderson. The suggested Department Hospital donation is \$.75 per member. Both donations are based on your June 30, 2024, membership number.
- **6. District Presidents and Auxiliary Presidents:** Please be sure that all Districts and Auxiliaries have filed their 990N or other appropriate 990 return by November 15, 2024. A copy of the acceptance confirmation for the 990N should be sent to Department Treasurer, Cindy Anderson.
- 7. **Standing Rules:** In accordance with Section 211 of the National Bylaws, Auxiliaries and Districts may establish Standing Rules to provide for specified operations, activities, events, expenses, and disbursements between meetings provided such rules do not conflict with the National or Department Bylaws. Standing Rules should be reviewed annually.
- **8. VOD and Patriot Pen Entries** are due to the Post/Auxiliaries by October 31, 2024. Judging of these entries at the Post/Auxiliary level should be completed by November 15 and the results forwarded to the District. Judging at the District level should be completed, and winners forwarded to Department by December 15, 2024.
- **9. Change in Officers:** Using the Officer Change Form please notify National Headquarters and Department Secretary Ginny Rosa of any changes in Auxiliary or District Officers. The above should also be notified of any changes of meeting dates, places, times, and dues amounts. This form is available on the Colorado Department website at www.vfwco.org.
- **10. District and Auxiliary Officers:** All officers must hold a 2025 dues card or life dues card by December 31, 2024. Any officer or chairman who has not renewed their membership ceases to be a member in good standing on January 1, 2025, and cannot hold an office of chairmanship unless dues are paid.
- 11. Buddy Poppy Orders: Please place your orders for the new Metal Poppy and the Original Red Cloth Poppy with the Department of Colorado VFW, 1400 Carr Street, Lakewood CO 80214. The minimum order is 500 poppies. If the Auxiliary and Post order together, be sure to note on the order form the amount purchased by each. There are now two Poppy Order forms that can be found on the Department website at www.vfwco.org and in the Colorado Program Book. Please be sure to use the correct form for the style you are ordering. Poppies can be ordered by the Auxiliaries but must include a VFW members membership number on the order. You must include freight in your payment as required per the order form.
- **12. Special events.** Please notify Department Secretary Ginny Rosa of an upcoming special event or celebration so that the Department and District Officers may attend if available
- **13. Auxiliary Treasurers:** The Department Membership Chairman asks that you please process 2025 dues for continuous members at least weekly. Send all new, rejoin and transfer applications to the Department Treasurer as soon as they have been accepted. Be sure that all applications are filled out and include the signatures of the investigating committee and the date elected.
- **14. District and Auxiliary Treasurers and Trustees:** The second quarter audit for the period July 1, 2024. Through September 30, 2024, should be completed by October 31. The audit must be accepted by motion within 60 days after the end of the quarter and a copy sent to the Department Treasurer.
- **15. District Dues** are to be remitted to the District Treasurer by September 30, 2024, of the current Auxiliary year or as established by the District Standing Rules based on the June 30 membership of the preceding year.
- **16. A Special Thank You** to all of those who attended the Parade of Programs in Cortez. The Program Chairmen did an exceptional job of promoting their programs and in providing information. Also, a special thank you to the Council Members and Auxiliary members who attended the Council Meeting on August 25' 2024. Remember that all members are encouraged to attend these events.
