VFWCO Notes:

#1 Taxation of the products. With our alcohol licenses we only pay tax on the product when it is sold by us. However, the donator had already paid sales tax on the same product and we would have to pay the sales tax again upon sale

#2 The product donated is not regulated. We buy alcohol directly distributors which guarantee the product is ready for consumption

No HB21-1079 -- Modify Property Tax Exemption for Veterans with Disabilities

VFWCO agrees with the larger premise of HB21-1079 but believes that the qualification for the property tax exemption should not be "permanent disability." We suggest striking and remove the five references to the term "permanent." The Dept. of Veterans Affairs very rarely issues permanent disability to veterans less than 100% service-connected disabled. Retaining "permanent" disqualifies thousands of veterans who could benefit from the bill. VFWCO offers our professional expert on Veteran Affairs Benefits for in-person testimony when the bill opens in committee

FISCAL NOTE: General Fund Expenditures Budget Year FY 2021-22 - \$2.2 million; Out Year FY 2022-23 Revenue - \$2.5 million.
